




## Real world learning

We constantly look for ways to make our teaching relevant to your future career. Most of our tutors have industry experience and some still work part-time in industry. We have invested heavily in professional standard facilities and equipment, and we involve employers in the curriculum.

We specialise in railway, highway and water engineering, an area particularly important for the region where HS2 will be built. Organisations regularly set our students realistic architectural projects. For example, the Trevor Osborne Property Group asked our architectural students to create designs for the Grade I listed Buxton Crescent, which they hoped to re-develop as a five-star spa hotel.

## Work placements

We encourage students to take a work placement, either for one year or for a shorter period, such as over the summer. These



provide valuable experience, contacts and usually a salary. If you undertake a year's placement, you might also be eligible for a Diploma in Professional Practice on top of your degree.

Recent students have found placements with world-renowned architecture firm HUF HAUS and construction company Tarmac, as well as many other small and medium-sized enterprises.

### Accreditation

Many of our courses are professionally accredited, which means that the appropriate professional body has judged it to be relevant and high quality. As well as giving you confidence in the course, accreditation usually means you can become a member of that professional body and attend its events. Sometimes you can gain professional qualifications alongside your degree or via a fast-track route afterwards.

### Markeaton Street

Architecture, civil engineering and construction courses are based at Markeaton Street, just a short walk away from the city centre and the University's main site at Kedleston Road. The site houses specialist equipment for technology, engineering, arts and design courses, and has some interesting design and construction features that control heat, maximise natural daylight and harness the heat from the sun.

In the national Higher Education Statistics Agency's 2014 survey of graduate leavers, the University of Derby was in the top 10% of UK institutions for graduate employment prospects with over 97% of students in work or full-time study within six months of completing their course.

At Derby we have a strong creative community where students and staff from all disciplines collaborate on a wide range of projects. This collaboration will give you a broad perspective of your subject and provide you with new and exciting learning opportunities.

## Real world learning

Our tutors have industry experience and continue to practise as artists and designers, bringing a wealth of current, relevant industrial experience and professional contacts.

You will have the opportunity to work with clients on live projects – real briefs set by external organisations, so that when you graduate you leave

us with a comprehensive portfolio of work to help launch your career. Recent students have worked with Oasis, Royal Mail, Transport for London and The National Trust.

## Work placements

We encourage students to take a work placement, either for one year or shorter periods of time. These provide experience, contacts and usually a salary. If you undertake a year-long placement you may also qualify for a Diploma in Professional Practice.

## Exhibitions and competitions

Our students showcase their work through competitions and exhibitions: New Designers in London, the Mercury Prize, Royal Society for the Arts, Young Creatives Network, Macmillan Children's Book Prize, Cheltenham Illustration Awards, and Association of Illustrators competitions.



All of our art and design courses culminate in an exhibition at our creative festival. It's a chance to celebrate your achievements and demonstrate your ability to potential employers and industry insiders.

### Masters level courses

We also offer MDes courses in Animation, Graphic Design and Illustration, which are highly regarded by industry. These are masters level degrees but are eligible for four-year loans. The final year gives you the chance to conduct an in-depth research project into an area of your choice.

### Inspirational Alumni

Derby University crafts degree graduate Paul Cummins created the Tower of London installation entitled 'Blood Swept Lands and Seas of Red'. The planting of 888,246 ceramic poppies in the dry moat at the Tower of London commemorated the fatalities of the First World War and drew international acclaim. Paul was awarded an MBE for his installation as part of the 2015 New Year Honours.

### An inspirational environment

Art and Design students are based at Britannia Mill and Markeaton Street, a site created specifically for arts, design and technology courses. Britannia Mill houses one of the best art and design libraries in the UK, as well as drawing studios for fine art students and major facilities for ceramics and fine art installation. There's also laser cutting equipment and printmaking facilities, including screen-printing and intaglio print, as well as a traditional wooden letterpress.

Study biological sciences at Derby and benefit from modern learning facilities and teaching staff who are world-class researchers.

#### Recognised courses

Our courses are recognised by the Society of Biology, so when you graduate you'll meet the requirements for Associate Membership of the Society of Biology and will be able to apply for full membership when you have appropriate professional experience.

They are also highly regarded by current students. In the 2014 National Student Survey, 92% of our BSc (Hons) Biology students agreed that staff made the subject interesting, while 93% of our BSc (Hons) Zoology students were satisfied with the teaching of this course.

#### Great learning environments

We've recently upgraded our facilities to make sure you have a fantastic learning experience. Our laboratories, insectary and glasshouse have been modernised and we have a new student research laboratory which is the perfect environment for you to carry out your independent study. You'll take part in site visits, both in the UK and abroad, to help develop your knowledge. Specialist guest lecturers will also give you key insights into the academic careers that you can pursue upon graduation.

#### World-class research

We pride ourselves on ensuring you receive the most up-to-date knowledge so you'll be taught by academic staff with excellent research records and professional recognition. All the staff use their research to make their teaching really engaging and they are dedicated to putting their students first.



#### Areas of our research include:

- Sexual selection in bush crickets
- Animal ecology
- Microbial diversity within aquatic environments
- Studies on endangered coral populations
- Cryopreservation of endangered crops
- Conservation strategies in cultural ecosystems
- Evolution of male care in primates

Our research has also been involved in a number of clinical trials on the biology of gynaecological cancers and improvement to treatment, such as clinical trials to determine if inspiratory muscle training can help relieve symptoms of breathlessness for advanced cancer patients.

We also actively research on aspects of psychological intervention to improve the quality of life in women suffering from polycystic ovary syndrome, as well as investigation of muscle as an immune organ in rock climbers.

#### Work Placements

We offer competitive student internships, which give you the opportunity to work with the academic staff and participate in their research. This will give you valuable hands-on learning experience, and increase your job prospects.



All of this will allow you to experience the challenges of applying criminological theory to policy and practice.





Nearby is Britannia Mill, where you can use the digital equipment for our three specialist textiles areas: knit, print and weave. We are one of the only universities in the country with a Monarch Knitwear system that produces fine gauge fabrics. All students also have access to our new dye lab.

We are one of only a few universities in the country to teach film using traditional celluloid, a medium that still dominates the feature film industry.

You'll undertake fire investigation training exercises with Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Service, and also present evidence in our courtroom to prepare you for real case scenarios.

## Professionally approved courses

Forensic science courses at the University of Derby are accredited by the Chartered Society of Forensic Sciences and endorsed by Skillsmark. This means that they are delivered to a recognised high standard. If you study BSc (Hons) Forensic Science, you may be eligible for Associate Membership of the Royal Society of Chemistry when you graduate.

## Experienced professionals

Our teaching team includes experienced current and former forensic scientists who have worked for the Forensic Science Service and Metropolitan Police. We have specialist expertise in blood spatter analysis, entomology, fingerprint analysis and firearms. We also have strong links with organisations such as Derbyshire Constabulary, Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Service and East Midlands Scientific Operations Unit (Forensic Science).

## You can make a difference

Forensic science impacts the lives of both the victims and perpetrators of crime. It's a rewarding and exciting career to choose as new technologies and developments constantly change and improve investigative techniques.



### Our students go on to great things

The skills you develop will also be relevant to different scientific careers and related opportunities. It's therefore no surprise that 90% of our BSc (Hons) Forensic Science students are in work or further study within six months of graduating, according to the latest national survey. For example, Ellen Stone, a BSc (Hons) Forensic Science graduate, now works as a forensic intelligence analyst and is an expert in fingerprint analysis. Her research project, which she completed while at Derby, won the Fingerprint Society's Haque Bose Practitioner Award that recognises contributions to further understanding of the uses of forensic identification.

## Professional recognition

Our BSc (Hons) Geology course and the Geology (Joint Honours) major pathway are accredited by the Geological Society, so when you graduate you'll have completed the first stage of professional training to become a Chartered Geologist.

## Create a course that suits you

The joint honours scheme ensures that you tailor your learning to the subjects that interest you most. It's a flexible way to study and provides a rich learning experience as you study alongside students on other courses.

## Equipping you for your course

We currently provide all of our first year BSc (Hons) Geology students with free basic field equipment. This includes a compass

clinometer, hand lens, hard hat, high-visibility jacket, professional field notebook and copies of the British Geological Survey's geological map of the UK.

## Stimulating field studies

Fieldwork brings your academic study to life and is included in your course fee. In Derbyshire we are on the doorstep of the Peak District National Park, one of the UK's most geologically interesting areas.

Our Geology students also carry out field studies in Wales, Scotland and Tenerife and go on industrial site visits. Our Environmental Hazards students take part in an overseas fieldtrip to explore earthquake zones or volcanoes – they currently have the opportunity to visit Pacific Northwest America.

## Latest research supports our teaching

Our students are at the heart of everything we do. As an undergraduate student, you'll work with academic staff, research professors and doctors who will keep you in touch with the latest developments and thinking.

Dr Andrew Johnson and Dr Annemarie Valentine have published papers about the



way modern and fossil sea shells preserve a memory of the temperature of the seawater in which they lived. Working with colleagues at the British Geological Survey in Nottingham and the United States Geological Survey, they are using these techniques to work out changes in past sea temperatures and so tell us about the changing climates of the past. Professor Hugh Rollinson is conducting research which seeks to build geochemical models of the continental crust sampling to evaluate existing crustal evolution models. He has been awarded a *National Geographic* grant to carry out field-related research in Oman.

### Real world learning

We'll provide you with real world skills to help you get the job you want. Our graduates have gone on to work in the Civil Service, land management, the petroleum industry and the geotechnical engineering and environmental sectors.



# Mathematics


For example, students enjoy working on the Mathematics Group Project, where managers from industry set a real and complex problem to solve. One year, for example, staff from Bombardier challenged students to optimise the turnaround time of the Virgin train fleet at its UK maintenance depot. More recently, students have used their mathematical skills to make production processes more efficient for Bosch.

## Work placements

We encourage and support students to take a work placement, either for one year or for shorter periods of time. These provide valuable experience, contacts and usually a salary. Students undertaking a year-long placement may also be eligible for an additional qualification – a Diploma in Professional Practice. Students have found placements with National Air Traffic Services (NATS), Serco's traffic control centre, HSBC and the Department of Health in London.

## Kedleston Road

Mathematics courses are based at the University's main site at Kedleston Road. It is just outside the city centre and all our halls of residence are within walking distance. You'll find easy access to everything you'll need, from local facilities and transport to shopping and nightlife. With small class sizes you will be well supported in your studies. # Motorsport and Motorcycle Engineering



There is a rich heritage of engineering at our University and motorsport is a key part of that. Donington Park race track, the heart of British motorsport, is just outside Derby, and as a student you will often attend events there and at Silverstone. Many of our previous motorsport engineering graduates have gone on to work with national and international race teams in F1, FIA-GT and GP2. Some have raced all over the world.

from the Institution of Mechanical Engineers (IMechE) and visits to race events through the University's motorsport club.

Theatre students will have opportunities to produce work for public audiences at the University-owned Derby Theatre, while music students can produce work for both live and recorded environments under the University's own record label. We encourage all of our performing arts students to form their own production companies under the mentorship of our professional staff.

### The creative scene

Derbyshire hosts a growing programme of creative festivals to help inspire your work, such as:

- Wirksworth Arts Festival
- Y-Not Music Festival

We also work closely with the QUAD arts centre, which screens world and independent cinema, exhibit works from national and international artists, and runs regular art and film workshops.

We'll travel to national and international festivals to help you showcase your work.

### An inspirational environment


Derby has fantastic facilities for performing arts. We own Derby Theatre, a professional theatre in the city centre, which is supported by Arts Council England as part of its national portfolio. Similarly, the regional dance centre, Déda, hosts our Dance course, so you'll learn from professional dancers and regular professional performances.

Derby Theatre has a mid-scale auditorium, a flexible studio theatre, workshop and rehearsal rooms, as well as a bar and bistro.

Déda is the East Midlands' dance centre. This beautiful historic building has a new dance and contemporary circus studio, conference and learning rooms, a newly refurbished theatre and a popular café bar.

Markeaton Street is where music students are based, alongside students on other arts, design and technology courses. It has specialist facilities including professional recording suites.





# Photography

Derby has an excellent reputation for photography. Our graduates include contemporary artist, Idris Khan, and leading US-based entertainment photographer, Steve Schofield. Derby is also home to the FORMAT international photography festival, which is jointly run by our University and QUAD, an independent cinema and arts centre. Our tutors have industry experience and continue to practice as professional photographers, exhibiting and publishing at both a national and international level. This means they bring with them a wealth of current industrial experience and professional contacts.

### Work placements

If you undertake a year-long placement, you may also be eligible to receive a Diploma in Professional Practice. Recently, students have been on placement to Getty Images, LGA London, Rep Limited and Surface Gallery, Nottingham.

- 4G Design tasked students taking the Furniture Design module with designing a child's bedroom chair made from recycled plastic. The two winners were given the opportunity to develop their products with 4G during a summer placement.
- Original Mountain Marathon asked students to develop a new harness and fixing system for their range of ultra-lightweight backpacks.

All our tutors have worked as product designers so you can make the most of their industry knowledge and contacts, and you will visit a range of manufacturing and design companies to gain further insight into the sector.

## Work placements

We encourage and support you to take a work placement, either for one year or for shorter periods of time. These give you valuable experience, contacts and usually a salary. If you undertake a year-long placement, you may also be eligible for a Diploma in Professional Practice. Both courses offer impressive employment prospects: in the Higher Education Statistics Agency's (HESA) 2014 survey of graduate leavers, 94% of our students were in work and/or further study within six months of graduating.

## Exhibitions and competitions

We'll encourage you to challenge yourself and promote your work by entering a variety of regional, national and international competitions. We select the most promising graduates to showcase their work at the New Designers exhibition in London and this can prove a turning point in their fledgling careers. For instance, a BA graduate, Sam Johnson, landed his childhood dream job as a Junior Designer for LEGO in Denmark after being spotted by an employee of the company at the New Designers exhibition. He's since been promoted within LEGO and interviewed for BBC Radio 4.


### Professionally approved courses

Both Product Design courses are based at Markeaton Street, which is just a short walk away from the city centre and the University's main site, Kedleston Road. Our product

design studio includes traditional drawing tables and boards, computer technology, a small photographic area for recording models and prototypes and a discussion space and relaxation area. There are also workshops, which house equipment for the manipulation of materials – traditional and powered hand tools along with manually operated and CNC machines. You can also get access to rapid prototyping technologies.



# Psychology



Take the first steps on your career in psychology with our single or joint honours degrees.

## Our courses

At Derby you can study BSc (Hons) Psychology or combine it with another subject in a joint honours degree. Whichever option you choose, you'll be eligible for the Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership of the British Psychological Society, provided you achieve the minimum standard of a second class honours. This is the first step towards becoming a chartered psychologist.

## Innovative facilities

During 2013 we revamped our psychology laboratories to create a learning space that fits your psychological study needs. It's important to us that you have the facilities you need to excel. Research will be a central part of your training to prepare you for your future career. From the start of your degree, you'll be introduced to our research facilities. Our psychological observation suite includes recording facilities, eye tracker equipment and project rooms which you can use for research. You'll also receive training in qualitative research design and skills such as interviewing.

## Inspiring curricula

We offer a range of optional modules based on the expertise of the professionals teaching you – for example abnormal psychology, parapsychology and cyberpsychology.

## Innovative, inspirational teaching

We think about how you can get the most out of your study and learn in the most effective way. You'll take part in group activities, lectures, practical work, seminars and workshops. You'll also have the opportunity to work in innovative ways by using virtual learning environments such as Second Life. In fact, quality inspectors have praised us for being 'at the forefront of technology enhanced learning'.

## Research active

We want you to understand the value of research in psychology, so it's important that you're part of a department that is actively researching and contributing to the field. We use our research to inform our teaching, resulting in a dynamic and stimulating learning experience. Our Centre for Psychological Research is organised into a number of clusters that focus on different aspects of research, including health and wellbeing, social psychology and the psychology of paranormal phenomena.





On this and the BA (Hons) Child and Youth Studies there are additional opportunities, such as Paediatric First Aid and British Sign Language.

## An expert team

Our academic team are passionate about what they do, and ensure that they are up to date with the latest developments within the sector.

They are also furthering knowledge within this field. Dr Ruby Oates, Head of Childhood Studies and Christine Hey, Senior Lecturer, have launched a new book called *The Student Practitioner in Early Childhood Studies: an essential guide to working with young children*. This book offers an insight into how students can develop skills when relating to children in childcare settings.

## A responsive department

The Department of Education and Childhood is responsive to the growing demand for highly qualified practitioners, and is exploring developments in Special Educational Needs and Disabilities and further opportunities related to the Early Years Teacher Status.

## Exciting partnerships

We have a well-established partnership with a local network of nurseries and primary schools to support professionals working with young children. All of our courses regularly feature expert guest lecturers to provide insight into practice in early years settings.

We also have a strong collaborative link with international university partners. Both our BA (Hons) Early Childhood Studies and BA (Hons) Child and Youth Studies students have opportunities to take part in field trips to increase their awareness of international education.

# Studying with us

We have courses to suit everyone – **full-time** or **part-time**, on **campus** or **online**, **one subject** or **joint honours**. Discover more about the options and what they all mean.



## Not quite ready for an honours degree?

We've got the following options:

- **Pre-sessional English** – If you want to improve your English language skills before you start an undergraduate or postgraduate degree course, our pre-sessional English course can help you.

It is a full-time course with 21 hours of class per week and self-study. Your class will be a vibrant mix of nationalities. You will study academic speaking, including presentations and seminar skills, academic listening, academic reading, including research and referencing skills and academic writing. You will also study vocabulary and grammar.

- **International Foundation Programme** – If you are an international student and

do not have the qualifications and/or English language level to start a degree, our International Foundation Programme will give you a recognised qualification so that you can move straight on to an undergraduate degree.

This course will help you to develop the English and academic skills that you will need during your degree.

You will study alongside other international students in a friendly and supportive environment.

Unfortunately this is not a loan fundable programme for EU students.

If you already have IELTS 6.0 and above you cannot apply for the International Foundation Programme.



#### ■ **Foundation Programme - Joint Honours –**

This course is for international students with IELTS 6.0 and EU students who want a loan fundable programme.

You'll study English and Maths at Level 2. As well as improving your language and numeracy skills you'll have the chance to develop your study skills to prepare you for undergraduate study.

This course will develop your confidence in writing essays and reports, undertaking research, analysing numbers, doing presentations, managing your time and working as part of a team.

You'll also choose two or three subjects to study to prepare you for your degree.

#### ■ **Foundation degree –**

If you don't have the appropriate qualifications to get straight on to a bachelors degree in a specific subject, we offer various specialised foundation courses that will help prepare you for your chosen undergraduate degree. Foundation degrees are equivalent to the first two years of a bachelors degree and will enable you to progress onto the final stage of an undergraduate course at Derby.

FdA – Foundation degree in Arts  
FdSc – Foundation degree in Sciences  
FdEng – Foundation degree in Engineering

#### ■ **Technology Foundation Programme\***

This is a one-year full-time or two-year part-time preparatory course that will

enable you to enter onto the first stage of an engineering or technology degree at Derby. It's a good option if you know you want to study an engineering or technology course here but don't have the entry requirements to enter onto a bachelors degree straight away.

#### ■ **Year Zero\***

Studied over one year, a Year Zero course prepares you to move on to a specialist degree in an art, design or technology subject if you're not quite ready to start a bachelors degree.

## Ready for a bachelors degree?

Sometimes called first degrees, there are a range of different options which you can study full-time over three years, or four years if you do a year on work placement.

**BA (Hons)** - Bachelor of Arts with honours

**BSc (Hons)** - Bachelor of Science with honours

**BEng (Hons)** - Bachelor of Engineering with honours

**BEEd (Hons)** - Bachelor of Education with honours (leads to Qualified Teacher Status)

**LLB (Hons)** - Bachelor of Laws with honours





## Single or Joint honours?

Many of our courses are available as single or joint honours degrees. Single honours means you have a single disciplinary focus for your study and will be awarded a degree in your chosen subject. By choosing joint honours you can combine two courses in different disciplines to create a bespoke degree. You can combine any two of the following courses provided they are in different zones:

## Two year degrees

Your learning will be the same as students on our standard three-year degree but your study will be condensed into two years.

## Top Up degrees

If you already have an HND or foundation degree, you may choose one of our top-up degrees. Top-up degrees usually take one year of full-time study.

## Taking your degree and masters all at once

We offer a small number of courses which combine undergraduate and postgraduate degrees, meaning you'll graduate with a masters degree. The benefit of this option is that you don't have to worry about relocating for a separate postgraduate degree. EU students can get a loan for the whole course.



## On campus study or online?

Some of our undergraduate courses can be studied online. Your learning materials are available online and our online tutors will guide and support you throughout your studies. Online learning is a great option for you if you need study to fit around your existing commitments.

## Part-time\* or full-time

If your lifestyle means you need a more flexible approach to study, many of our courses are available to study part-time. Options include evening courses, day release or online study.

## Visa support

If you are a national of a European Economic Area (EEA) country or Switzerland, you do not need a visa to study.

If you are from any other country then you will need to apply for permission to study in the UK.

### Student Visitor Visa

You will need a Student Visitor Visa if you are studying a course that is less than six months long or you are studying an English language course that is less than 11 months long. To be eligible, you must:

- Be 18 or over
- Have been offered a place on a course in the UK
- Have enough money to support yourself without working or help from public funds, or have relatives and friends who can support and house you
- Be able to pay for your return or onward journey.



### Tier 4 (General) Visa

You will need a Tier 4 (General) Visa if you are coming to the UK to study a full-time course for more than six months. To be eligible, you must:

- Have an unconditional offer from the University of Derby
- Have enough money to support yourself and pay for your course.

We have a dedicated Visa and Immigration Adviser who is available for you to contact before, during or after your course.

**Ian Turner**  
**Biology and Forensic Science**

Award-winning lecturer Dr Ian Turner is something of a science superhero. A Senior Lecturer in Biology and Forensic Sciences, Ian has been named a National Teaching Fellow – these awards recognise a small number of people each year for excellence in teaching in higher and further education. Ian is well-known among his students for his novel approach to lecturing, where his emphasis is on educating the audience

by entertaining them. Costumes, props, drama and even the odd handstand can feature in his lectures. Ian has also delivered popular public lectures, sometimes in costume, on the science behind comic book heroes' powers, *Dr Who* and *Star Wars*.

Ian says: "Aristotle said educating the heart without educating the mind is no educating at all. I take this to heart and try and make sure my teaching is both enjoyable and enlightening by using any means necessary!"





### Becky Manton Teacher Education

Rebellious crayons and friendly giants may seem unlikely teaching aids, but Becky Manton is putting them to good use in the classroom. A University of Derby graduate, Becky (pictured left) is a former primary school teacher. She has been sharing her love of teaching with students since she became Senior Lecturer in Teacher Education in 2012. In 2013 she was awarded the University's Vice-Chancellor's Award for Inspirational Lecturer of the Year.

Becky uses children's literature, from classics such as Roald Dahl's *BFG* to new picture books such as Drew Daywalt's *The Day the Crayons Quit*, in every class she teaches.

Becky is passionate about her role, which she says is not making students teach a certain way, but to give them possibilities and encourage them to find their own teaching style. Becky firmly believes that learning happens all the time and that her passion for teaching comes across to her students when she teaches them.

### Denis O'Connor Fine Art

Denis O'Connor has been teaching Fine Art at Derby for 20 years. Once a full-time lecturer and course leader for Fine Art, these days he strikes a balance between teaching and his own creative output. Denis's company, Sculpture Works, creates art for public spaces both in the UK and Ireland. Alongside this, he produces work for museums and galleries.

He uses his experience beyond the classroom in his teaching. Students from the Fine Art course have been involved in a project with the National Trust at Ilam Park in Staffordshire since 1994 – here they work to interpret the natural landscape through making site-specific art works. This is one of a variety of options open to second year students – others include work with local manufacturer Rolls-Royce and with Derby Museum.

"It's hard to survive as an artist," says Denis, "So I like to both engage and encourage students to undertake opportunities within the wider arts network."

Denis is also a firm believer that travel extends students' critical and social thinking and co-ordinates European field trips to explore art and culture in cities such as Berlin, Barcelona and Madrid. "Students come back fired up from the trips," he says. "They're a great way to learn."


**Destinations of Leavers from Higher Education Survey 2012/13**


Mikaela became interested in events at the age of eight and applied to the University of Derby at the age of 18 to pursue her interest.



# DERBY

## Derby Campus

Most of our courses are based at our busy Derby Campus, which has three sites:

- Kedleston Road
- Britannia Mill
- Markeaton Street.

You might have classes at one or more of these sites depending on what course you are studying. It's easy to walk between all three and they are all in safe residential areas on the outskirts of the city centre.

## Learning facilities

The University's main library is at Kedleston Road and this stocks thousands of books, journals, special collections, DVDs and other media, over several floors. You can use a range of equipment in this library: computers, printers, photocopiers and scanners, and you can loan out laptops, DVD and video players from here too.

There are lots of different areas to study in and these are zoned so that group discussions don't disturb those who need a quiet place to work. Wi-Fi is available throughout the building as is accessibility equipment, such as rise and fall desks, screen readers, text magnifiers, specialist software and overlays.

Britannia Mill has one of the best art and design libraries in the UK, including a large collection of artists' books and art slides.

## We've invested millions of pounds in our real world learning facilities including:

- A 350-person capacity courtroom for our law courses
- A crime scene car and house for our forensics courses
- An NHS standard clinical skills suite
- Derby Theatre, a working theatre where our Theatre Arts students are based.



### Other facilities

The Kedleston Road site is where you'll find most of Derby Campus's other facilities, including shops, cash machines and a variety of places to buy hot and cold food.

The Student Employment Agency and the Employability and Enterprise Hub are based here too, and will help you prepare for your future career and find part-time work.

A brand new multi-million pound sports centre will open at Kedleston Road in summer 2015.

## A creative town

The proportion of Buxton's working population employed in the creative industries is more than double the average for this region. The town hosts a number of renowned arts festivals each year, including Buxton Festival Fringe – which many artists use as a preview before appearing at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe.

## An adventurous town

Buxton is surrounded on three sides by the Peak District National Park, so it has become a centre for adventure sports, including abseiling, mountain biking, horse riding, scuba diving and rock climbing.

- Oaklands Manor is our 58 acre adventure activities centre and home to our exciting outdoor courses.



## Study support

# FEES AND FUNDING

**Money matters** – going to university is a real investment in your future and it's good to know the full facts up front.

**There are two types of cost you'll need to consider:**

## Tuition fees

The fee reflects the actual cost of delivering the course and covers all equipment and activities. You will find all your textbooks in the library. This means that you will not have to find additional cash during the year for anything other than your living expenses.

### Classroom-based courses:

£10,900 per year- international student fee

£8,500 per year - EU student fee

These courses are delivered in a lecture theatre or seminar room and do not involve any specialist facilities or equipment.

### Resource intensive courses:

£11,190 per year- international student fee

£9,000 per year- EU student fee

These courses use more resources so we reflect this in the tuition fee.

## Living costs

In addition to tuition fees, you'll need to budget for your living costs, including accommodation, food, bills and entertainment.

## How fees work for EU students

You don't have to pay your fees up front. When you accept a place at Derby you can then apply to the Student Loans Company for a loan to cover your tuition fees. You don't need to repay anything until you have graduated and your salary has reached a specific level (in 2015/16 this is £21,000 per year). If you never reach that salary level, you won't pay anything back.

If you do reach that salary level, you'll pay back 9% each month of any income over £21,000. So, if you were earning £25,000 you would pay back £30 a month. You pay interest on your loan until it is paid back in full. After 30 years, any outstanding debt is written off.

## How fees work for international students

All international students who pay their own tuition fees must pay a 50% deposit prior to arrival in the UK. The amount of your tuition fee deposit will be confirmed in your offer letter from the University. You will have to pay the remainder of your fees before you start your course.

## Loans and bursaries for EU students

Full-time EU undergraduates can receive some financial support.

You'll be able to get a loan to help cover your tuition fees. You will need to apply for the student loan from the Student Finance Services European Team in Darlington.

You may be eligible for a £500 bursary if:

- You are a full-time EU student
- Your household's income is less than £15,000 per annum.

If you are eligible for a bursary, you must apply for this at the same time as you apply for your student loan. You need to submit a EU15B form. Unfortunately, this money isn't available for advanced standing students as you must be studying in the first year of your degree.

### Sport scholarship

Are you a talented athlete? You may be eligible for a scholarship or bursary to enable you to study while training and competing in your sport. ## International scholarships

We have a number of merit-based scholarships available for international students to apply for when you have received an offer from us. These are £2,000 and £3,000 and are available for anyone who is a full-time student from outside the EU in their first year of study at the University of Derby.

If you pay your fees in full by enrolment you will receive a £500 discount on all courses.

## Online courses

Online courses are classed as part-time study. New EU undergraduate students who are resident in England and self-funding may be eligible for a part-time tuition fee loan.




# Applying

We attend a number of overseas education exhibitions and visit many countries throughout the year. At these events, we can give you and your parent's advice on our courses, and studying and living in Derby. Please check our website <http://www.derby.ac.uk/international/country/events/>

Make sure you allow plenty of time to research and decide on your course choice before you apply. We accept international applications until July. In some cases, we may be able to accept late applications, but you should aim to apply by mid-July. Some courses will fill up fast so you should apply straight away to avoid disappointment.

You will need:

- To meet the UCAS tariff points for your chosen course through A-levels or vocational qualifications (or International equivalent)
- Usually five equivalent GCSE qualifications including maths at grade C or above. (or International equivalent)
- IELTS 5.5 - please check your course requirements
- To show through your application and personal statement that you are enthusiastic, motivated and have the potential to benefit from coming to university

We may also invite you to interview via Skype or ask you to submit a digital portfolio if that is part of the entry criteria for your course.



We have a greater staff to student ratio than many other UK universities so we have more time to focus on you. Over 85% of all classes have fewer than 30 students but there are far fewer than that in most postgraduate classes. You will also be allocated a personal tutor for individual support.

### **10% off for alumni**

If you've already completed a full undergraduate degree here, you could get a 10% discount on your postgraduate course fees. That's another great reason to stay at Derby.

### **A rising research profile**

In the latest national assessment of university research – the Research Excellence Framework – three quarters (74%) of Derby's research was ranked as at least 'internationally significant' and up to 'world leading' standard. That's up from two thirds (66%) in the previous assessment.

### **Research that's changing lives**

We focus on research that will have a clear impact on how we understand, navigate and make changes to our world. Recent successes include:

- developing a new medication-free way of tackling depression and anxiety
- helping to predict the extent of climate change
- influencing national policies around equality and human rights
- changing approaches to investigative interviews with victims, witnesses and suspects of crime.



The Institute for Innovation in Sustainable Engineering helps manufacturing and engineering companies in our region to innovate and grow through R&D and Knowledge Transfer Partnerships. It's the home of around 30 research students and its facilities include 3D printers and scanners and other rapid prototyping equipment, and a virtual reality lab.

Our Clinical Skills Suite brings healthcare theory and practice together. It includes a fully equipped hospital ward, the most up to date radiography and imaging facilities (including ultrasound, x-ray and bone densitometry equipment), a domestic living suite and rehabilitation kitchen, and counselling rooms.

We are the only university to have its own commercial day spa, where you can get hands-on management experience. It is equipped with industry standard facilities including: a sauna, steam room, hydrotherapy pool and hammam tables.



Our Forensic Training Facility looks like a normal four bedroom house from the outside, but inside it includes up to seven replica crime scenes and a blood pattern analysis room. Custom-built to precise specifications, it's used by the emergency services for training as well as forensics students.

If you have entrepreneurial ambitions, we offer dedicated business support services for all stages of your business journey. We can guide you through the practicalities, such



# CHOOSING YOUR DEGREE

**Whether you're looking to develop your career or get back into study after a break, we have a range of options across many subject areas. We offer flexible study options – full-time, part-time and online – so you can fit your learning around your other commitments.**

## TYPES OF DEGREE

### Postgraduate taught courses

Our postgraduate taught courses are the most popular. Studying a postgraduate degree allows you to specialise in an area that closely matches your interests, skill sets or career ambitions. Most postgraduate students build on the knowledge they gained in their undergraduate degree, but some postgraduate courses allow you to change direction and study a completely different subject.

Our masters degrees usually consist of three stages: Postgraduate Certificate, Postgraduate Diploma and Masters. You'll need to successfully complete each stage before progressing to the next.

Some of our postgraduate taught courses are only available at Postgraduate Certificate or Postgraduate Diploma level, for example our Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE).

### Different masters degrees

We offer a range of masters degrees including:

- Master of Arts (MA)
- Master of Science (MSc)
- Master of Business Administration (MBA)
- Master of Laws (LLM)
- Master of Research (MRes).

### Professional qualifications

Professional courses are aimed at people who have experience of working in a specialist area and who want to further that career. You don't always need an undergraduate degree for these. They are often recognised qualifications accredited by professional bodies, such as the Institute of Acoustics, Health and Care Professions Council or the British Association for Behavioural and Cognitive Psychotherapies.

## RESEARCH DEGREES

### Professional or practice-based doctorates

We offer professional or practice-based doctorates in business administration, education, health and social care practice (in a named field) and professional practice. They differ from our MPhil and PhD degrees as they include a substantial modular-based element and the thesis must relate to the area of practice.

### MPhil and PhD degrees

These degrees allow you to embark on original research, culminating in the production of a thesis or creative work and a critical appraisal, and leading to the award of either a Master of Philosophy (MPhil) or a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD).

### MPhil

You'll gain a strong knowledge of the subject, taking the discipline forward through an approved programme of original research, supported by two supervisors. If you hold a first degree it's a good choice for you. It usually takes two years full-time or four years part-time.

### Traditional PhD

The traditional PhD enables you to pursue an original research investigation into a chosen topic within a field of enquiry, fully supported by two supervisors. You'll study for between three and six years.

### Integrated PhD

If you're a recently qualified graduate with a good honours degree but don't have significant training in research methods, our Integrated PhD may suit you. You can gain this research degree by completing a programme of modules. It can take a little longer than the traditional route to PhD (four to six years), but you'll also have the opportunity to achieve a Master of Research (MRes) award.

### PhD by Published Works

If you already have a series of research-informed published or creative works, this route may suit you. You will need to prepare these works for examination and undertake a critical appraisal that contextualises and reflects upon them.

### PhD by Concurrent Publication

For this route, you need to prepare and submit research-informed publications to relevant journals/publishers or undertake creative works for public exhibition or other public recognition. In addition, you will need to write a critical appraisal of these works that contextualises and reflects upon them.







# AREAS OF RESEARCH

**We are particularly interested in applications to undertake research that addresses one or more of the following:**

- **Art and Design:** including arts and interdisciplinary practice; cultural value; arts practice and wellbeing; and new technologies and sustainability.
- **Biological Sciences:** including conservation; biodiversity; animal behaviour; and ecosystem sustainability and evolution.
- **Business and Management:** including supply chain management and logistics; accelerating the shift to a low carbon economy; transforming the customer experience; business networks; and sustainable tourism development.
- **Communication, Cultural and Media Studies:** including identity, conflict and representation; society, religion and belief; sociological and historical studies; American Studies including postwestern studies and War on Terror; culture, lifestyle and landscape; and creative writing.
- **Computer Science and Mathematics:** including cloud computing; data science and big data analytics; cyber security; green IT; and distributed and intelligent systems.
- **Earth Systems and Environmental Sciences:** including bio-geoscience; climate change and its lived experience; and bioavailability.
- **Education:** including career education and guidance; educational philosophy; academic freedom; emotions in education and teaching; and higher education.
- **Engineering:** including innovation in sustainable engineering; built environment; electrical, electronic,

audio engineering; and software systems.

- **Health and Social Care:** including public health; primary care and health services research; and arts, health and wellbeing research.
- **Law:** including medical law; crime; offender management; and policing.
- **Psychology:** including behaviour change; health and wellbeing; nature connectedness; emotion regulation; identity and relationships; and cognitive processes.

## HOW YOU'LL STUDY

### Campus based courses

For these courses, much of your learning will be based at one of our campuses in either Derby, Buxton or Chesterfield, and may include traditional lectures, seminars, discussion groups, projects and more. We also use technology and media to bring you the most up-to-date learning resources. You can find out more about our campus facilities on page 17-23.

### Online courses

With online study you don't need to attend fixed lectures or travel to one of our campuses. Therefore, these courses make it easier for you to

study alongside your career or other commitments. You can access your study materials at any time on your computer or mobile devices and still work towards achieving a UK university degree.

All courses are still structured, so they are based around trimesters and there are assessment deadlines. You'll have the opportunity to engage with your tutors and fellow students through online discussion boards, café forums, wikis, blogs, Skype and online live taught sessions.

Our academic teams are experts in their respective fields and specialists in online learning, ensuring you have a valuable and stimulating learning experience. You'll also benefit from additional support and guidance from your personal online learner adviser.

### Distance learning courses

A few courses are offered by distance learning. As with online learning, this type of study may be suitable for those who can't commit to attending lectures at fixed times. It can take a variety of forms. You may find you'll receive a learning package by post or email which you can work through at a time and pace to suit you, within module timescales. You'll be fully supported by tutors via phone and email.

# FUNDING YOUR STUDIES



**Our approach to tuition fees is simple: the fee reflects the actual cost of your postgraduate course and includes all the essential equipment and activities.**

At the time of print our course fees for 2016/17 were not set. However, to give you an idea of the likely cost, your selected course leaflet shows our 2015/2016 prices for UK/EU and international students. Fees for research degrees can be found at [www.derby.ac.uk/research](http://www.derby.ac.uk/research). You can check our website from early 2016 to see the new prices.

## UK STUDENTS

### Flexible payments

If you're studying part-time and paying for yourself, we make it easier for you by automatically spreading the cost of your course across the academic year. The repayment dates depend upon when you enrol on the course. You would only begin paying for a term's modules once you have enrolled on those modules.

For instance, if you start in September, the fees for your first term's modules will be charged as follows:

- **25% when you enrol plus all registration fees**
- **25% on 1 November**
- **25% on 1 January**
- **your final 25% on 1 March.**

You will then usually enrol on more modules for the second term in January, so from this date you may have a number of 25% payments overlapping throughout the year.

### Loans

You may be able to access a Career Development Loan to support your study. Currently these allow you to borrow up to £10,000 from a high street bank and you'll pay no interest while you study.

### Disabled Students' Allowance

If you're a higher education student living in England, with a disability or long-term health condition (including learning difficulties and mental health conditions) you may be eligible for support through the Disabled Students' Allowance scheme. The support you receive depends on your individual needs and not on income or savings.

### Support for teacher training and social work/healthcare courses

If you are taking a PGCE, you should be able to apply for loans, grants and bursaries. You can find out more at [www.gov.uk/teacher-training-funding](http://www.gov.uk/teacher-training-funding).

If you are studying a social work or healthcare course, you should be able to apply for a bursary. You can find out more at [www.gov.uk/social-work-bursaries](http://www.gov.uk/social-work-bursaries) or [www.gov.uk/nhs-bursaries](http://www.gov.uk/nhs-bursaries).

### 10% discount for alumni

If you've already completed a full undergraduate degree course with us, you could get a 10% discount on your postgraduate course fees. This applies to most postgraduate courses although you must be paying the fees yourself.

### Sponsorship by an employer

If you're working, you may find that your employer is willing to pay some or all of your fees. If this is the case you'll need to submit a sponsor letter. Check our website to see what the sponsor letter needs to include.

### EU/International students fees

EU postgraduate students are usually charged the same tuition fees as UK students. However, it will depend on you fulfilling certain criteria – we assess everyone individually and will let you know the amount you need to pay for your course. Some international students also pay the same tuition fees as UK and EU

students – for example, if one of the following applies:

- You have permanent residence in the UK and have been living here for three years
- You are an EEA migrant worker or a family member, who has lived in the EEA for three years
- You are an EU national, or the spouse or child of an EU national who has lived in the EEA for three years
- You are a refugee (recognised by the UK Government) or family member
- You or your family have applied for asylum and been granted exceptional or discretionary leave to enter or remain, or have been given humanitarian protection.

Otherwise, you will pay international student fees, which are at a higher rate.

### Financial support

EU and international students are also eligible for the following funding (detailed above):

- 10% discount for alumni
- Financial support for teacher training and social work/healthcare courses
- Sponsorship by an employer.

In addition, international students who pay their tuition fees in full before they enrol will qualify for a discount of £500 (not available to research students) and we also have a number of **£2,000 and £3,000 scholarships**, which all international students (including research students) can apply for. These are awarded based on merit.

# CITY OF INNOVATORS



Derby has a long-standing tradition of innovation. Part of the UNESCO Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site – the birthplace of the factory system – the city and surrounding area can trace their spirit of invention back to the Industrial Revolution. These days Derby is proud to be the home of world-leading companies including Toyota, Rolls-Royce and Bombardier. As well as these manufacturers, Derby has vibrant creative sectors, with software development and gaming among its areas of expertise.

## Investing in the future

The University is as forward-thinking as the city and is continually investing in improved facilities. Our Derby Campus has sites at Kedleston Road, Markeaton Street and Britannia Mill and also owns Derby Theatre, a working theatre in the heart of the city. A new £12 million building for science, engineering, technology and maths (STEM) at our Markeaton Street site is due to open in 2017.

The majority of our courses are taught at Kedleston Road. A bright and modern site with a stunning glass atrium at its centre, this is where you will find the University's main library which stocks thousands of books, DVDs and other media over several floors. Within the library there are also zoned areas for quiet study and group discussion.

Kedleston Road is also home to the Students' Union, Academy Bar, Blends coffee shop and other places to eat, as well as a doctor's surgery, bookshop and Keddie's, the Student Union-run shop which stocks stationery, snacks and other essentials.

## Facilities at Derby include:

- The new Derby Law School building at One Friar Gate Square. This includes a specialist law and criminology library, full law court, criminology laboratories, lecture theatres and seminar rooms
- A £10 million sports centre, opened in summer 2015 at Kedleston Road. It features a 70-station gym, fitness and cycling studios, squash courts,



sports hall with eight badminton courts and a climbing wall. The centre is used both for participation in sports and teaching on our undergraduate and postgraduate sports courses

- A forensic laboratory and forensic training facility, including a crime scene house where realistic scenarios provide a unique opportunity to develop your investigative skills
- Biology laboratories, including an insectary and glasshouse
- Motorsport and engineering workshops at Markeaton Street
- A dedicated auditorium, rooms for post-production and AVID editing suites at Markeaton Street.



### Did you know Derby...?

- is the most central city in the country, only 90 minutes from London by train
- has a population of more than 248,000
- has more than 45,000 people working in the engineering and manufacturing sectors and four times the national average of workers employed in hi-tech functions
- is the birthplace of Lara Croft – the Tomb Raider character was created here by Core Design for the computer game in 1996
- is home to Derby Arena, which includes a 250-metre indoor cycle track and plays host to our graduation ceremonies.

# A SPA TOWN WITH A SENSE OF ADVENTURE

**Buxton is a historic spa town, often nicknamed the 'Bath of the North'. The town attracts more than a million visitors every year – they come to enjoy its magnificent buildings; beautiful Pavilion Gardens; its programme of cultural festivals featuring opera, music and literature; and its location on the edge of the stunning Peak District National Park.**

It's this proximity to the Peak District that has made Buxton a centre for adventure sports. Mountain biking, horse riding, caving, kayaking, scuba diving, rock climbing and abseiling are all on offer in Buxton or nearby. The town also hosts the Buxton Adventure Festival.

A major project is now underway to restore the town's 18th century Crescent and transform it into an 80-room five star hotel, complete with thermal water spa. This will be one of only two natural mineral water spa facilities in Britain.

## **A landmark campus**

Our campus is a visitor attraction in its own right, located in the historic Devonshire Dome. This 18th century Grade II\* listed structure is larger than St Paul's Cathedral in London. Restored in 2005, it's the breathtaking centrepiece of our campus and plays

host to weddings and many other events. Built originally to house the servants and horses of guests staying at the nearby Crescent Hotel, it later became the Royal Devonshire Hospital and used spa baths in the treatment of its patients.

Buxton Campus is home to our masters degrees in events, hospitality, spa, and tourism. On-campus facilities include:

- **The Devonshire Spa, a commercial day spa which is an ideal training resource for our spa students**
- **A café and a small shop selling snacks, drinks and student supplies**
- **The Devonshire Library which has fixed PCs, loanable laptops and study spaces; it also houses a career and employment centre**
- **Harpur Hill Sports Centre, which is a short bus ride away from the main site, and includes a fitness suite and gym, a hall with space for various sports, and an outdoor climbing wall.**

## **Did you know that Buxton...?**

- **is the highest market town in England (so expect some snow!)**
- **is the home of Buxton mineral water**

- **is one hour from Derby by car and one hour from Manchester by train**
- **has a population of 24,000**
- **attracts 1.3 million tourists each year**
- **has a large proportion of people working in the creative industries – more than double the average for this region.**


# A GROWING CAMPUS

**Our Chesterfield Campus is modern, small and friendly and is currently home to some of our nursing students. If you're studying on the Return to Practice course, some of your teaching will take place here. We've invested around £400,000 in this site recently, to provide you with comfortable surroundings and the latest equipment.**

Its facilities currently include:

- **A state-of-the-art clinical skills suite**
- **An IT suite**
- **A virtual classroom**
- **A café**
- **Group study areas and a hospital library.**

There are plans to create a bigger campus in Chesterfield by 2016, on the site of a former grammar school. It's hoped that the new site will house engineering as well as nursing courses, and include incubation units for start-up businesses. Chesterfield town centre and its amenities are only a short walk away.





# SUPPORTING YOU



**We know that your wellbeing is crucial to your academic performance, so our Student Wellbeing team provides a range of services to support you. This includes:**

- **A confidential counselling service**
- **Doctors' surgeries either on-campus or close to campus**
- **Support for people with long-term health issues, including disabilities, mental health conditions, autistic spectrum disorders and learning difficulties**
- **Useful information about childcare, local schools, support and funding for students who are parents**
- **Financial guidance and help with budgeting**
- **Several chaplains and faith advisers who represent our diverse multicultural community.**

You will usually need a qualification equivalent to a UK undergraduate degree (lower second or above). You will also need an English language qualification. We accept all UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) approved tests. You will need at least:

- **IELTS 6.0 (with minimum 5.5 in each component)**
- **International GCE O Level English Language, grade C**
- **International GCSE English or English as a second language, grade C**
- **PTE score of 51.**

### Certificate of Good Conduct

If you're from outside the UK, you may also need to provide us with a Certificate of Good Conduct from the country or countries you have been living in since the age of ten. We can advise you on how to obtain this.

### Improving your English

If English is not your first language and you want to improve your skills, we can offer English language support throughout your course. Our International Student Centre runs informal conversational groups, where you can practise your English and meet other international students.

### Helping you settle in

Our welcome programme for international students takes place a week before the UK students arrive. During this week you will receive lots of useful information, make new friends, find your way around, and most importantly, get answers to all your questions. You can even join us on free trips to London! One of our current students will help you settle in and we also offer a free pick-up service from several airports around the UK.



# HOW TO APPLY

## Taught postgraduate or professional courses

You can make your application through our easy-to-use online application system at [www.derby.ac.uk/applyonline](http://www.derby.ac.uk/applyonline). All you need to do is set up an account; you can then select the courses that interest you and make your applications. If you're applying for more than one course, you'll need to submit multiple applications.

We consider applications for taught degrees throughout the year, but we recommend applying at least six weeks before your expected start date.

If you are applying for a PGCE, you need to apply through the UCAS Teacher Training website.

### Before you apply

Before using our online application system, you'll need to have:

- copies of any existing qualifications (such as certificates)
- a copy of one form of photo ID such as a passport or driving licence
- a reference – preferably from a previous academic tutor or alternatively from an employer
- a personal statement
- proof of your residence.

Before uploading documents (such as exam certificates and identification), please note that the system recognises JPEG, PDF and Word documents. Only five documents can be attached to any one application. If you have more than five, simply proceed with your application and contact us to let us know.

## International or EU students

If you are an international or EU student, you can apply in exactly the same way as UK students (see above) or you can use one of our agents – the choice is yours. If you do use one of our agents, we will send all letters to them as well as to you.

## Before you apply

Before making your application, you'll need:

- a completed RD02 MPhil-PhD by Thesis Application Form
- copies of degree certificate(s) and transcript(s)
- a copy of the photo page of your passport (showing name and date of birth)
- a copy of your current visa if applicable
- a copy of your IELTS certificate (this must be a recent qualification gained within the past two years)
- two signed academic references (standard RD03 can be used, or letters of reference can be provided).

All documents can be scanned and emailed. We can't process an incomplete application so everything listed above must be fully completed and all supporting documentation supplied. It's likely you'll then be called for interview. This gives us the opportunity to explore your academic experience and knowledge of specific subjects.

You can start at any time of the year except June or July and all enrolments are arranged by appointment once your application is successful. Please be aware that it can take between six and 12 weeks to consider a complete application.

## International or EU students

If you are an international or EU student, any offer made will initially be conditional, subject to you either

paying a deposit of £5,000 or providing a sponsor letter. The deposit will be deducted from your tuition fees when you enrol.

If you are offered a place you must then:

- provide a copy of your Academic Technology Approval Scheme (ATAS) certificate if applicable, and
- indicate a firm start date for your studies.

When we receive the deposit, ATAS certificate and notification of the start date from you, we will issue a Confirmation of Acceptance to Study number, which you can use to obtain a student visa.

We must also be satisfied that you have adequate English language skills to undertake a research investigation. This will be a minimum of IELTS 6.5 with a minimum of 5.5 in each element (reading, writing, speaking and listening). English language certificates are only valid for two years.

Please note: The **£5,000** deposit will be refunded only if you can provide proof that a visa has not been granted.




