# **Our campuses**

The University of Gloucestershire has three campuses, two in Cheltenham and one in Gloucester. Each has its own distinctive atmosphere and subject areas taught on campus.

### **Oxstalls campus**

### - 15 minutes' walk from Gloucester city centre and station

Located in the heart of Gloucester, Oxstalls is home to our Performing Arts and Events Centre, brand new sports arena, top-spec nursing facilities and School of Business and Technology.

Here, our students train and compete with elite athletes, perform and produce shows, work alongside real businesses and gain valuable industry connections. This is a high-energy campus of forward-thinking and competitive students.





### Francis Close Hall campus and Hardwick

### 10 minutes' walk from Cheltenham town centre 20 minutes' walk from Cheltenham Spa station

Referred to as 'the Hogwarts campus' and known for its community feel, Francis Close Hall (FCH) is a truly inspiring place to study.

Home to our health and social care, liberal arts, education and natural and social sciences courses, this is a campus of ground-breaking research and modern theory. Complete with Gothic library and chapel, FCH allows our students to take inspiration from the old to create something new.

### **Park campus**

- 20 minutes' walk from Cheltenham town centre

## Accommodation

Moving away from home is a big and exciting step to take, but it can also feel a bit scary.

Don't worry, whether you want support and a family away from home, freedom and independence, or the best of both worlds, there are lots of options to suit everyone.

### **Halls of residence**

Halls of residence can be a great start to university life. All halls are situated on or near our campuses, as well as being close to the town and city centres and are all served by our university bus service. The university has approximately 1,800 places in halls of residence, including spaces in our brand new accommodation.

### Blackfriars, Gloucester city centre

A mix of townhouses, cluster flats and studio bedrooms, our Blackfriars Residences, developed in partnership with CityHeart, are situated in the centre of Gloucester.

### **Pittville Student Village**

Our brand new Pittville Student Village boasts landscaped grounds, bar, shop, gym, faith space and 24/7 onsite security. With almost 800 rooms, many en-suite, built in villa-style flats and townhouses, the village is a 15-minute walk to Cheltenham town centre, with regular bus services running until late on student nights.

### University-approved housing

Halls of residence aren't for everyone. You may want to consider shared houses and flats instead. This option involves finding a property away from campus that is privately owned. The university has a database of properties that have been checked to make sure they meet the necessary health and safety standards. The landlord does not live in the property and you share with other students. This is a popular choice with our international students!

### **University-registered lodgings**

In lodgings you rent an individual study bedroom and share the communal facilities (kitchen, lounge and bathroom) with the resident landlord/lady and possibly their family. As there is no legal tenancy, this can be a good option for students only staying part of the year or wanting to move somewhere else. These houses also tend to be quieter as you would not usually be sharing with other students.

### If I apply for university am I guaranteed a room?

Yes there is an accommodation guarantee, students should check the website for the relevant deadline dates for each guarantee. www.glos.ac.uk/life/accommodation/pages/ halls-application-process.aspx

### What happens if I don't pay my accommodation deposit before I arrive? Will I still have a room?

Students must pay a £200 booking fee to reserve their room before arrival.

### Can I book a room when I arrive in Gloucestershire?

Students should ensure they have booked appropriate accommodation before arriving in Gloucestershire. You will need to book at least short-term accommodation for your arrival if you intend to search for private accommodation. Short-term rental options can be found here www.glos.ac.uk/docs/download/Accommodation/ Other-accommodation-options.pdf

### Can I request a specific residence?

Yes, you will choose your top three residence choices. We cannot guarantee that you will receive your first choice, it will depend on when you apply for accommodation and what is available as we allocate on a first come, first served basis.

### How are rooms allocated? Will I be living with students on the same course?

We allocate on date order of receiving applications, as close to individual choices as we can. You will find that you are usually accommodated with at least a few people on the same course as you. Postgraduates are allocated in separate flats together.

### Can I request alcohol free, quiet or same sex accommodation?

We do not have specific alcohol free, quiet or same sex accommodation. However, if you have any special requirements we suggest you note these on your application and we will see if we can accommodate requests.
