

2 Applying

Submit your application online:

- · Scan all documents (in separate files).
- Fill in the online International Application for Admission. (world.viu.ca/apply)
- Upload your scanned documents in separate files.
- Pay the \$150 (CAD) non-refundable Application Processing Fee (Visa, Mastercard, and American Express are preferred. Cheque, money order, and electronic transfer also accepted).
- Once you have submitted your online application you will receive an acknowledgment email with the receipt of payment.

Note: Your application will not be processed until the \$150 (CAD) application fee is received, and all required scanned documents are uploaded.

3 After you apply

- Once your application fee has been paid and all of your documents have been received, we will begin to process your application.
- It can take from 2-8 weeks to process an application. Ensuring that all of your documents are scanned in separate files and attached to the online application decreases wait time.

Note: Masters programs and limited entry programs may take longer.

- You will receive a Letter of Offer (LOO), if you have met the
 admission requirements and have a competitive application.
 The LOO contains information on program start dates and
 instructions to pay your tuition deposit. You must pay the
 tuition deposit by the date indicated in the LOO.
- Once the tuition deposit has been paid an official Letter of Acceptance (LOA) will be emailed to you. With the LOA you may apply for your study permit online at cic.gc.ca or at an authorised Visa Application Centre in your country.
- Bring your original documents to Canada.
- Ensure that we have an email address that you check regularly, and then read all emails carefully. They will include important pre-arrival information including course registration instructions, immigration information and housing deadlines.

Note: We encourage early applications.

For masters programs, your LOA will not be issued until the tuition deposit is paid and all original or certified documents are received.


