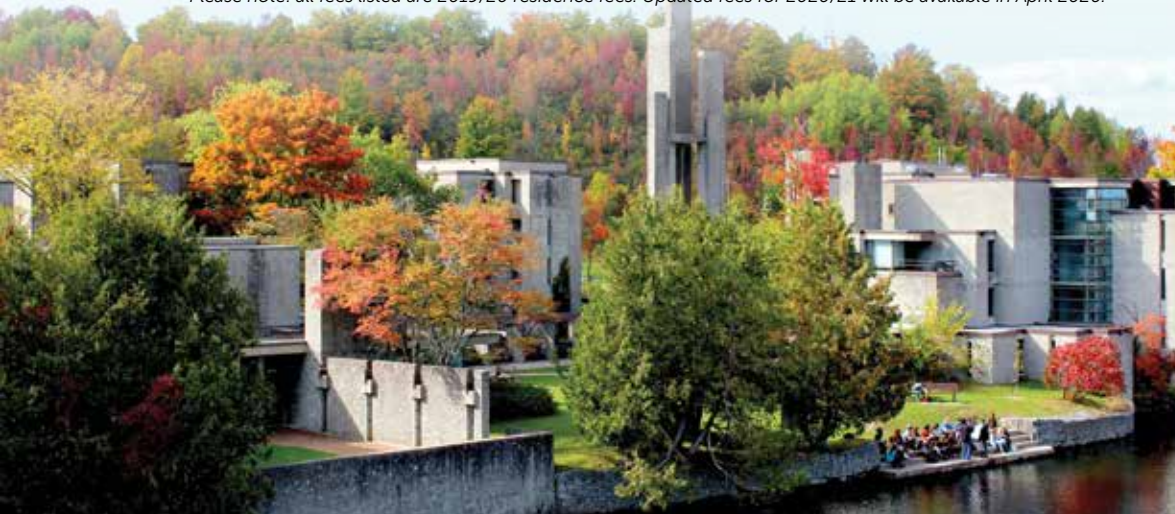
DINING AT CHAMPLAIN

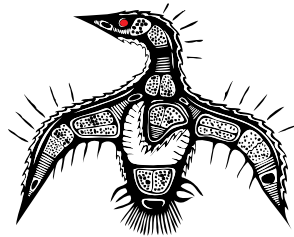

PETER GZOWSKI COLLEGE

Gzowski College is named after distinguished Canadian broadcaster and former Trent Chancellor, Peter Gzowski (pronounced *zaw-skee*). Adored by Canadians, he was most famous as someone who listened and welcomed conversation and diverse opinions. That makes it appropriate that Gzowski College is housed within Trent's Enwayaang Building, an Anishnaabek word meaning "the way we speak together."

Indigenous knowledge is central to our spirit and influences our programming and collaborations with departments in our collegiate community – the First Peoples House of Learning, School of Business, Departments of Economics and Mathematics, Office of Research and Innovation, and the Chanie Wenjack School for Indigenous Studies. Field trips, craft fairs and community lunches are held alongside guest lectures and workshops to support our students' academic development, career aspirations, leadership and sense of belonging. Our Enwayaang building (affectionately called "the Big Cheese") is known for its bright yellow colour, "Ochre Number 33."

Listen, share, "speak" and learn with us. We move into the future speaking together.

Don't miss this! Once a month, Chef Christopher goes all-out to craft premium meals at Gzowski. Lobster tail, prime rib, and steak. He does it all.

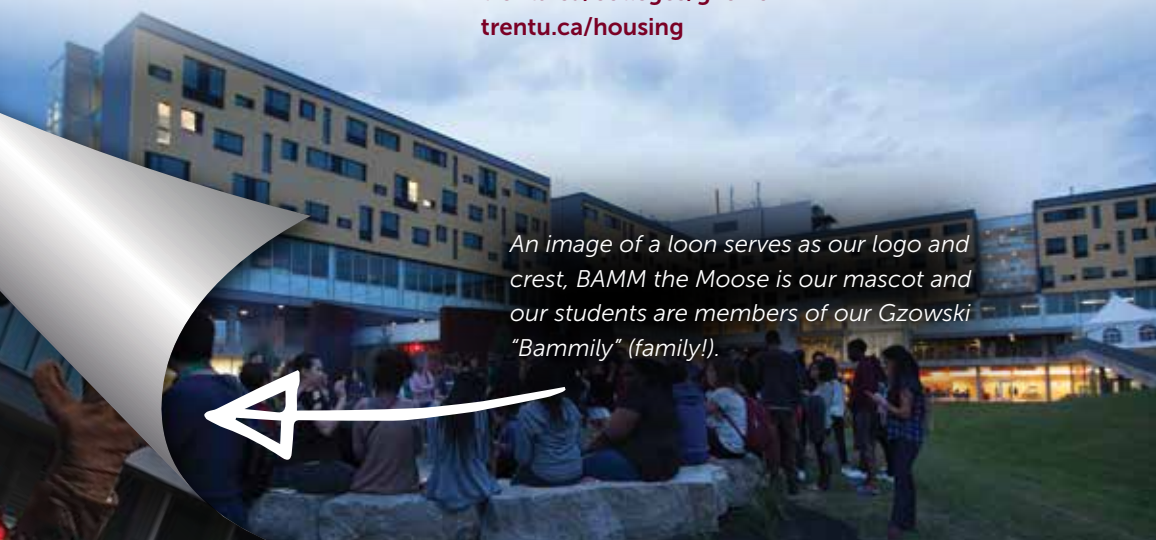

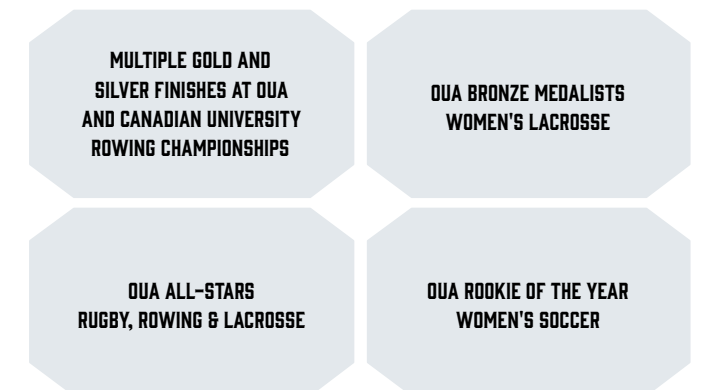

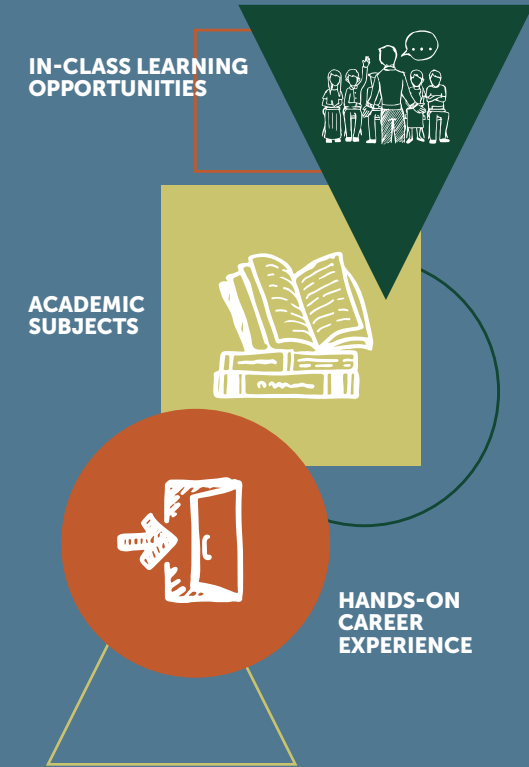

A HANDY LIST OF ACADEMIC TERMS

DEGREES: Also known as a "Bachelor's degree" or "undergraduate degree", this is the first level of study at a university, often a three (general) or four year (honours) program that prepares you for your future profession or the next step of your academic career.

MAJOR: The primary area of study within a degree program, a major involves intensive focus on a particular discipline.

MINOR: An optional secondary field of study that can be related to or different from your major, a minor is usually selected after you begin your studies

OPTIONS: Often referred to as "mini minors," options are a prescribed set of courses in a discipline outside of your degree. These specific areas of study can be completed alongside almost any undergraduate degree program. A unique focus to your degree provides you with a distinct advantage in the career of your choice.

SPECIALIZATIONS: Distinguish your degree by adding a specialization and gain deeper understanding of your chosen discipline. Adding a specialization shows future employers or graduate schools that you're focused and interested in becoming an expert in your field.

DIPLOMAS: Diploma programs are a great choice for enhancing your broad-based knowledge. They can be completed in 12-24 months, and often lead to a degree program.

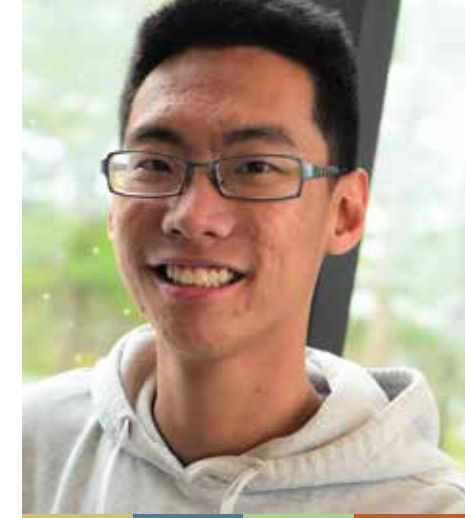

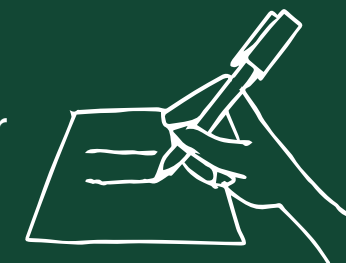

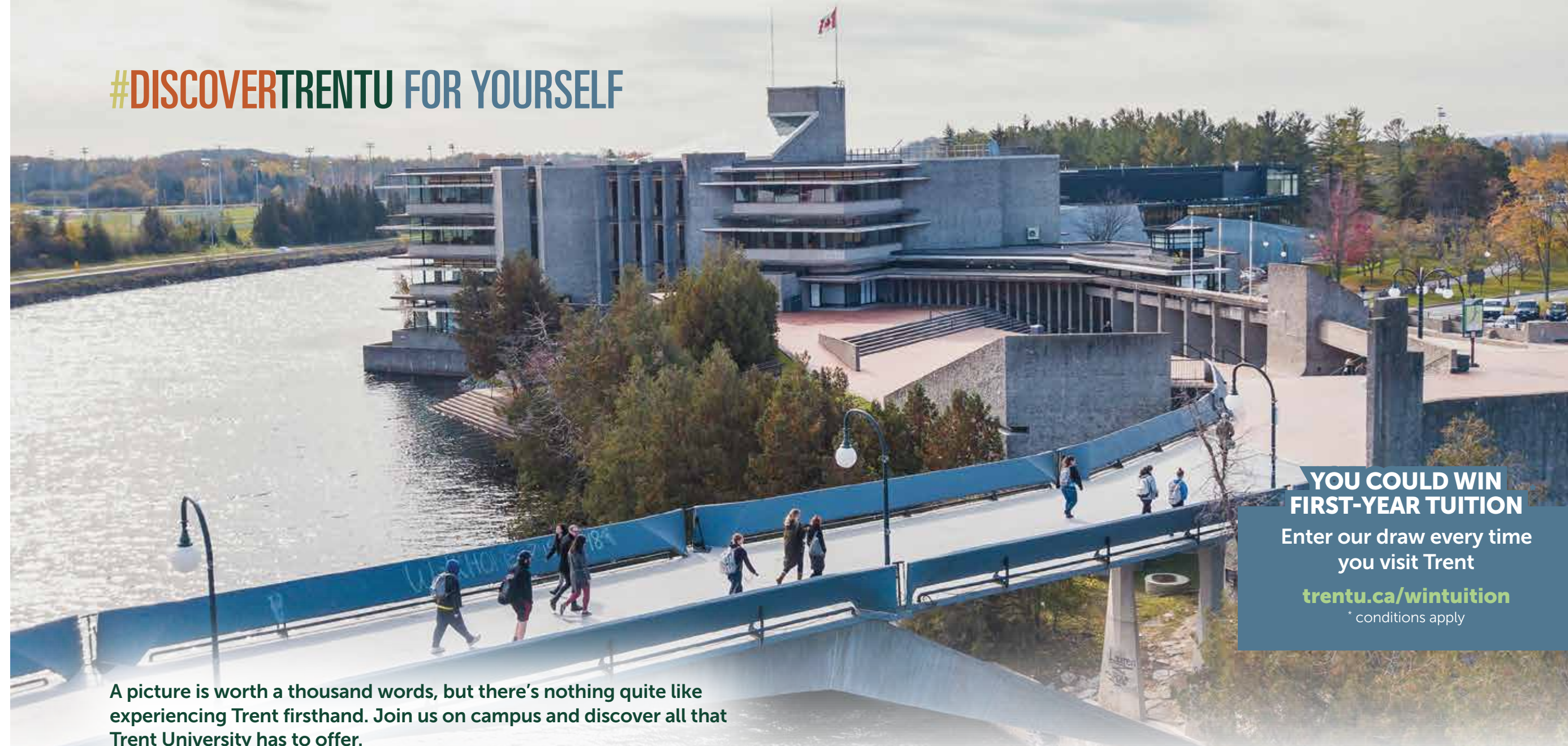
Conditional Admission through Trent-ESL

College and University Transfer Students

Applicants transferring to Trent University from an accredited Canadian university must have successfully completed a minimum of one semester, with a final minimum average of 65% to be considered for admission. Individual courses with a minimum grade of 60% will be considered for transfer credits. Applicants who have completed at least one semester in a Canadian community college, with a minimum cumulative average of 65% will be considered for admission. Each course with a minimum grade of 70% will be considered for individual transfer credit. trentu.ca/transfer

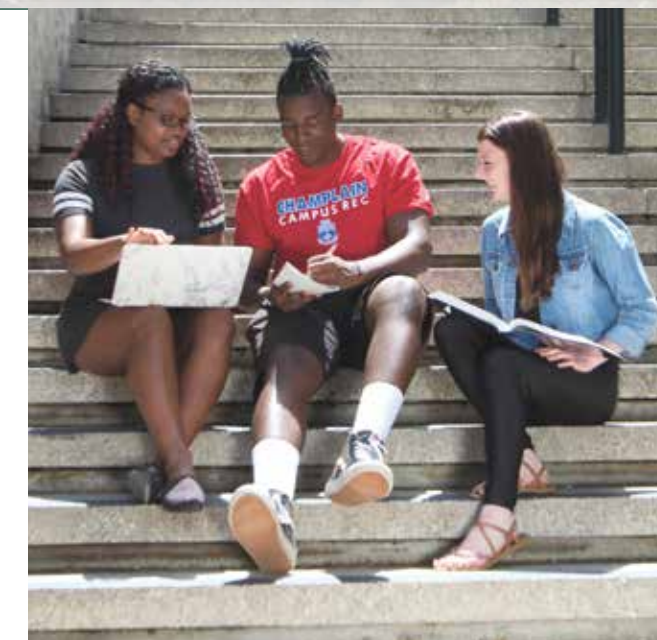
