## University Transfer

University transfer is a system that lets you take up to 60 credits at CNC and then transfer those credits to any university in British Columbia and many across Canada. When you finish your degree, you graduate from the university you transferred to.

British Columbia boasts the best and most seamless college-to-university transfer system in Canada. Advantages of studying at CNC’s university transfer program include:

- Same courses, same quality, same information as in university.
- CNC instructors are personable, involved and available to meet with you. Teaching you is their main focus.
- Small class sizes mean personal attention to individual students and a closer relationship with instructors and classmates. You’ll see the difference in your GPA as a result.
- The courses you take at CNC are equivalent to a university, but cost less.

## Associate Degrees

The Associate Degrees in Arts and Science allow you to transfer into the third year of university at any public university in British Columbia. Associate degrees cover a broad range of university-level subjects, and prepare you for further education as well as for an enriched life as an educated person.

All public universities in BC that offer traditional arts and science degrees guarantee 60 transfer credits for students who have completed an Associate of Arts Degree or an Associate of Science Degree.

# Unique Programs

## One year certificate program

### Professional Cook

Cook up your dream career. Fast-paced and rewarding, a career as a professional cook lets you express your creativity. You'll find jobs at hotels, exotic resorts, cruise ships and local restaurants. You might even own your own restaurant one day. By combining theory with practical assignments, you will build a strong foundation to develop your skills. Students from past years have used this approach to achieve high standards as demonstrated in provincial, national, and international competitions, as well as launching many fine careers.

The program covers all basic fundamentals of cooking and is designed to prepare you to enter the hospitality industry. You are trained through theory, demonstrations (lab), and practical experience in production areas and actual banquets, both plated and buffeted.



## One year university transfer certificates

### Engineering

Start your studies at CNC before transferring to university to finish your degree. Most university engineering programs are oversubscribed in the first year and even students with very high GPA's won't get in. Attending CNC guarantees admission to UBC and greatly improves admission possibilities to other universities when your first year courses are complete.

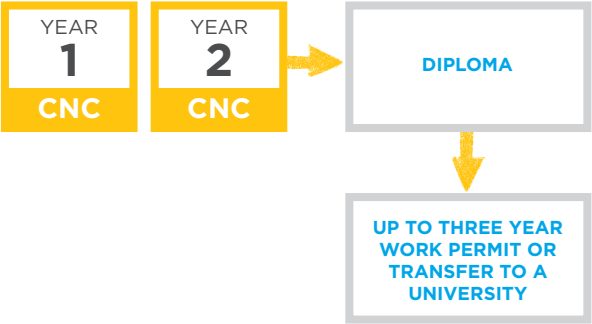

# Post Diplomas

Our post diplomas provide practical, in-depth knowledge in various subject areas. Class sizes are small and interactive, our instructors bring current industry experience to the classroom, and our students graduate with the applied skills and knowledge to take into the workplace. Having these applied skills increases your ability to gain employment, leads to higher salaries and broadens your scope of work.

### Information Technology (PDIT)

CNC prepares you for one of the fastest growing employment sectors in the Canadian and international job market. According to Information Communications Technology Council (ICTC), Canada is approaching a major technology talent shortage. There will be upwards of 182,000 positions that need to be filled in this field by 2019; CNC's program is designed to meet this demand with qualified graduates. Careers include but are not limited to: information systems analysts and consultants, computer and network operators, web technicians, computer programmers and system testing technicians, database analysts and data administrators.

### Human Resources Management (HRM)

### Tourism and Hospitality Management (TRMG)

Excellent work opportunities upon completion of the program; from now until 2030 there will be a labour shortage of 228,000 in Canada. The Post Diploma in Tourism Management (TRMG) provides you with a great opportunity to gain an in-depth understanding of tourism management and practical skills needed to pursue supervisory and management careers in the rapidly expanding domestic and international tourism markets. Includes 12 courses and a tourism/hospitality practicum.

## Health Sciences

The College of New Caledonia offers the opportunity to study a variety of university-transfer level health sciences courses, which can be transferred to university towards many health science related degrees including pharmacology, physiology, psychology or rehabilitative medicine.

If you enroll in university-transfer health sciences courses at CNC, you are eligible to apply to our specialized programs such as:

- Practical Nurse Diploma
- Bachelor of Science in Nursing (Northern Collaborative Baccalaureate Nursing Program)
- Health Care Assistant Certificate
- Medical Laboratory Technology Diploma
- Dental Hygiene Diploma

If you wish to follow this path, you should ensure you have strong grades in grade 12 biology, chemistry and mathematics.

*Please note: depending on your desired program, some specific university-transfer courses may be required.*

## Applied Research

Gain a competitive edge in the workplace by participating in an applied research project as part of your course work or as a paid Student Research Assistant. Applied Research connects industry, business and community partners with the expertise and facilities at CNC to conduct research and development, solve business challenges, and take advantage of market opportunities.

Research projects enhance the quality of CNC's programs by providing a learning opportunity that goes beyond the classroom. You will gain real world hands-on experience while working side-by-side with our faculty, research associates and industry partners.

# Accommodation

## HOMESTAY

Homestay offers you the opportunity to live with a Canadian family. A private bedroom will be given to you, but you will share the rest of the house with your host family. One advantage of choosing Homestay is the ability to improve English language skills quickly. Host families communicate with you only in English and your language skills will increase rapidly.

The Homestay program also gives you a chance to learn more about the community and Canadian culture in a supportive family environment. Host families are interested in learning about you and will ensure you are comfortable and well taken care of.

You may apply to the Homestay program when you apply to CNC. At the time of application, you will send in the non-refundable application fee and the deposit. To apply, visit [www.cnc.bc.ca/ined](http://www.cnc.bc.ca/ined)

**Fee: \$700 per month** (includes food)

## RESIDENCE

CNC offers a 92-room student residence on campus. The residence features comfortable rooms with a fridge, microwave, storage area, desk and bed. Common areas shared by all students include three different lounge areas, kitchen and laundry facilities. The park-like grounds feature a patio and barbecue, and grassy lawns perfect for outdoor games. Student advisors live in the residence during the school year to assist students with any issues that arise. Rooms are comfortable and are adjoined to one other room by a shared bathroom.

**Fee: \$450 per month** (food not included)

## HOUSING

Prince George has a wide variety of housing options if you wish to rent off-campus. Apartment rental costs are much lower than in bigger cities, averaging at \$700/month for a 2-bedroom apartment, while private house rentals average around \$900/month. With a wide variety of apartments and private housing located within either walking distance or a short bus ride from CNC, enjoy independent living and the chance to fully integrate into Canadian culture.

### INTERNATIONAL STUDENT LEADERSHIP AND AMBASSADORSHIP PROGRAM

Leadership opportunities are plentiful at CNC. If you are interested in enhancing your leadership skills, you can volunteer in a wide range of activities from hosting and organizing cultural and student events to fundraising. Once you have completed your volunteer work, you will receive a leadership certificate from the International Student Leadership & Ambassadorship Program. Graduates of this program also receive a letter of reference from our department which can be used as part of your university applications.

Student activities occur year-round, providing a varied schedule of fun events like sightseeing trips to Jasper and Banff, ski trips, movie nights, pot luck lunches, dances, sports and more.

### INTERNATIONAL CENTRE

Choosing your educational journey at college can be a challenge. That's why we offer an International Academic Advisor at CNC, who helps our international students select their courses, ensures they have all the requirements for their college qualification and advises them as they complete their university applications. When personal counselling or career counselling is needed, the Student Services Centre is available with expert assistance. International Education staff provides help reconciling student finances, study permits and health insurance. In short, our international team is there to share your concerns, celebrate your successes and help you overcome any challenges you encounter during your studies at CNC.



# Study Abroad

Traveling and studying abroad is a great way to gain valuable international experience which can be applied to your career and professional pursuits. Join one of our international field schools, international volunteer projects, or complete your practicum abroad. Travel to exciting and interesting places including Costa Rica, Italy, Korea, China, and a wide range of communities in Asia, Africa, and Latin America.

# Work and Study

For CNC students interested in working part-time while studying, and/or working during their school breaks and after their graduation, Prince George has many employment opportunities. Staff at CNC will help you surmount employment challenges by assisting you in acquiring study permits with off campus work permission and the completion of your Social Insurance Number application.

As of June 1, 2014, students may qualify to work off campus without a work permit. Pending your qualification, your study permit allows you to:

- work up to 20 hours per week during regular academic sessions and
- work full-time during scheduled breaks, such as the winter and summer holidays or spring break

Working off campus is a great opportunity for students to gain valuable work experience, and a paycheque to help offset the costs of living abroad.

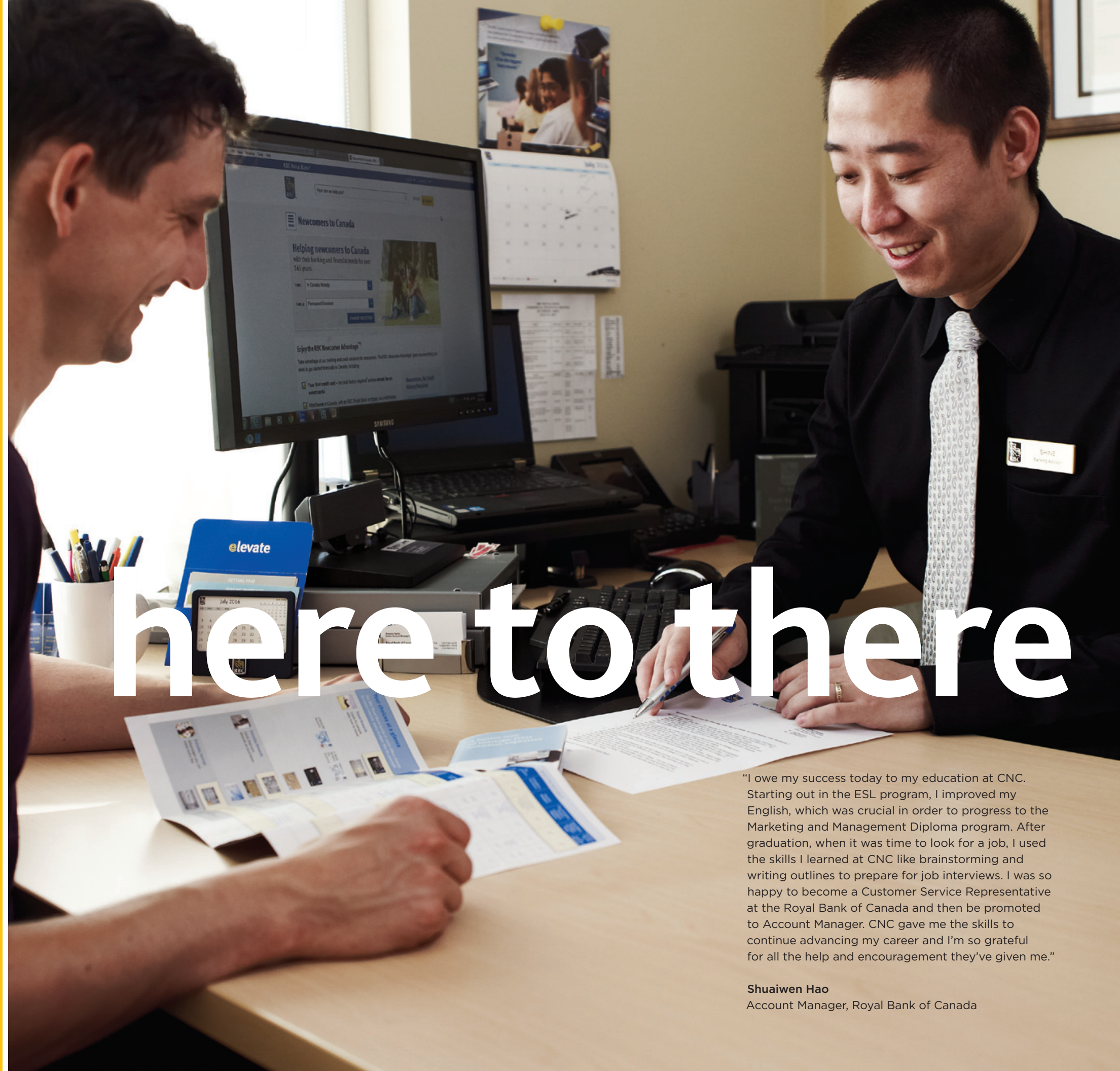
# Work After Graduation

## Post-Graduate Work Permits Program (PGWPP)

The PGWPP allows students who have graduated from CNC to gain valuable Canadian work experience. Skilled Canadian work experience gained through the PGWPP helps graduates qualify for permanent residence in Canada.

A work permit under the PGWPP may be issued for 12 to 36 months depending on the length of your study program.

International Education staff hold regular workshops to assist students interested in applying for their Post-Graduate Work Permits (PGWP). In order to apply, you must have a valid study permit and provide proof of graduation (certificate and final transcript). You have 90 days after completion of your studies to apply for your PGWP.

# Become a Student

## Admission Requirements

The College of New Caledonia offers programs through three semesters in each calendar year.

- September (Fall Semester)
- January (Spring Semester)
- May (Summer Semester)

It is best to apply at least six months before the semester you plan to attend. However, applications are accepted until the start date of each semester, providing there are seats available in the program you apply for.

To qualify for admission, you must meet the following requirements:

### English as a Second Language

- Be 17 years of age

### Certificate, Diploma, Associate Degree, or University Transfer:

- Be 18 years of age
- Completed high school or the equivalent of BC Grade 12 with English 12 minimum “C” grade (must provide transcripts)
- Meet all specific program requirements
- Have a minimum TOEFL score of 80 (IBT), an IELTS score of 6.0 or equivalent as determined by College of New Caledonia or have completed CNC’s English for Academic Purposes

## Steps to Apply

- 1 Submit your completed Application Form.
- 2 Submit any required documents (Transcripts, TOEFL/ IELTS scores, front page of your passport).
- 3 Submit \$125 application fee.
- 4 If you meet general admission requirements, you will be sent a Letter of Offer (by email only).
- 5 Once you have received your Letter of Offer, you will need to finalize your education funding.
- 6 CNC requires a tuition deposit of \$6500 from all international applicants; once we receive your deposit and any outstanding documents, we will send you a conditional Letter of Acceptance.
- 7 As soon as you receive your Letter of Acceptance, complete a Study Permit application at your nearest Canadian Consulate.
- 8 You are required to advise us when you receive your Study Permit.
- 9 Orientation at CNC is mandatory. Please be sure to allot time for this when making travel arrangements. Send us your arrival date one week before arrival at CNC.
- 10 Submit your Homestay Application Form (if applying). *(Note: There is a \$200 application fee and a \$700 refundable deposit)*
