Our environment

The Northern Territory covers some of Australia's most dramatic landscapes, from tropical wetlands in the north to red deserts in the south. This extraordinary environment shapes life and character in a profound way.

CDU's academic focus is influenced heavily by its location – North Australia and the immediate South-East Asia region.

Darwin is Australia's gateway to Asia. Great cities of South-East Asia are among Darwin's nearest neighbours and Darwin is closer to seven major Asian cities than to any Australian capital.

Some of Australia's most spectacular natural attractions and outback adventures are found in the Northern Territory. To the east of

Darwin is Arnhem Land, a place of rich Indigenous significance, and the World Heritage listed Kakadu National Park.

To the south of Darwin, in Central Australia, is another World Heritage site – Uluru (Ayers Rock) and Kata Tjuta (Olgas) National Park. Around Darwin are some of the finest fishing grounds and sailing waters in the world.

Scholarships

Each year CDU offers around \$1 million worth of scholarships. Students are encouraged to apply for as many scholarships as possible. You don't have to be top of your class for your application to be successful. CDU awards scholarships on the basis of passion and initiative in your chosen area of study and on criteria such as leadership, commitment to the region you live in, sports involvement or financial need. Scholarships also vary in

what they provide. Some are one-off payments to help with study costs. Others provide up to \$15,000 a year for five years, totalling \$75,000. Others still offer paid work placements, providing additional income and work experience. Most range between \$2,000 and \$10,000 and are paid directly into your bank account, allowing you to decide how the funds are used.

Entry to CDU

In most cases, entry to one of CDU's undergraduate courses will require one of the following:

- Successful completion of Australian Year 12 with an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR) at the required level approved for admission to your chosen course
- Successful completion of a national VET or TAFE qualification at Certificate IV level or higher
- Successful completion of at least half a year of full-time study (or equivalent) of a Higher Education degree or diploma
- Overseas secondary or tertiary qualifications considered equivalent to the above Australian qualifications
- Attainment of a Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) score at the required level approved for admission
- Successful completion of the CDU's Tertiary Enabling Program (TEP) or another recognised bridging or tertiary preparation course.
- For most VET courses, all you will need to do is complete the online VET101 Enrolment Form. Most certificate courses do not have specific entry requirements but do require a satisfactory level of literacy and numeracy. Diploma courses require successful completion of year 12 (or equivalent), completion of a certificate IV, or relevant experience. If you wish to study for a diploma but didn't complete year 12, check out our Tertiary Enabling Program.
