



Applying to CSUDH as a **First-Time Freshman**

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The university's criteria for admission as a **First-Time Freshman** are met if a student:

1. Is a high school graduate;
2. Has a qualifiable eligibility index; and
3. Has completed with grades of "C" or better each of the courses in the comprehensive pattern of college preparatory subject requirements ("a-g"). Courses must be completed prior to enrollment at CSUDH. Summer coursework will not be considered for fall admissions.

Before You Apply, Gather Your Info:

You'll need to have:

- Your official high school transcript.
- Transcripts for any classes taken at other institutions (if applicable).
- Your official SAT I or ACT test scores.

Applying to CSUDH as a **Transfer Student**

UPPER DIVISION ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS*

Upper division students are eligible for admission to the CSU if they meet the following requirements:

- Have completed 60 transferable semester units (90 quarter units).
- Have completed at least 30 semester (45 quarter) units of general education courses, graded "C" or better in each course including:
 - o 1 course of 3 semester (4 quarter) units in written communication,
 - o 1 course of 3 semester (4 quarter) units in oral communication,
 - o 1 course of 3 semester (4 quarter) units in critical thinking, and
 - o 1 course of 3 semester (4 quarter) units in mathematics/quantitative reasoning. The mathematics course must be above the level of intermediate algebra.
- Are in good standing at the last college or university attended.

Before You Apply, Gather Your Info:

You'll need to have your official transcripts from all institutions attended whether or not coursework was completed.

■ STEP 1: APPLY

Complete your application and pay the \$55 nonrefundable application fee online at CSUMentor.edu. Apply for financial aid at fafsa.gov; California Dream Act applicants apply at dream.csac.ca.gov.

You can also pay the fee by sending a \$55 check, made payable to "CSU Dominguez Hills" to the CSUDH Cashier's Office. Include the student's name and date of birth and/or the application confirmation number (sent via email) on the check.

Note: You can request a fee waiver when applying online at CSUMentor.edu. Fee waivers are only available to qualified California residents from low-income families and approved AB-540/AB-2000 applicants.

■ STEP 2: ACTIVATE YOUR **My.CSUDH.EDU** ACCOUNT

Your application confirmation letter will include the information you need to activate your **My.CSUDH.EDU** online account.

■ STEP 4: CONFIRM YOUR INTENT TO ENROLL BY **MAY 1, 2017** (FALL ONLY)



