At CGU, it's not a 'one size fits all' approach to your education. We offer a transdisciplinary education that opens the door for you to learn different perspectives and ways of thinking. As a student, you are encouraged to pursue educational and research interests that transcend the usual boundaries of academic disciplines. You'll be able to follow a broader intellectual path. This allows you to choose coursework from different and diverse academic departments, providing the widest possible body of knowledge to address any issue.

You'll have the freedom to pursue studies in a single discipline, or create a course of study and research that draws from several academic fields within the guidelines of degree requirements. The programs at CGU offer varying levels of transdisciplinary options through flexible requirements and exchanges between schools; for specifics check with your program representative. You may also enroll in a dual degree program and earn two separate degrees simultaneously in different fields, saving time and money without sacrificing quality.

CGU will prepare you for the real world. In addition to traditional theory and research, our schools and departments also stress the skills, knowledge, and problem-solving techniques that employers seek. This applied focus is often the reason our students chose CGU over other graduate programs.

Oxford was the model used to create The Claremont Colleges—a group of academic institutions situated around a commonly used library and other resources—a place that was at one time surrounded by orange groves. Founded in 1925, CGU is the only comprehensive graduate-only institution of the renowned Claremont Colleges. Here, you can expect a high-caliber education set amid a small-town atmosphere and supported by world-class resources.

The Claremont Colleges is a unique consortium of highly-regarded institutions that includes: Pomona College, Scripps College, Claremont McKenna College, Harvey Mudd College, Pitzer College, Claremont Graduate University, and the Keck Graduate Institute of Applied Life Sciences. As a CGU student, you can take courses at any of the colleges as well as at the Claremont School of Theology and the Rancho Santa Ana Botanic Garden. Cross-registration is free.

The Claremont Colleges provide university-scale services and facilities, including four libraries with more than two-million volumes, health and counseling centers, athletic facilities, ethnic centers, an interfaith chaplaincy, a performing arts complex, and an array of extra-curricular activities.

Surrounded by old-world charm and old-growth trees, the city of Claremont is just 35 miles from Los Angeles, one of the world's most exciting, diverse, and metropolitan cities. Claremont is the perfect place to study hard, enjoy local culture, raise a family, or plot your next big career move, all the while enjoying sunshine nearly every day of the year. You'll be within easy driving distance of Southern California's beaches, mountains, and deserts, as well as a tremendous array of social, cultural, and sports activities.



Here, you can earn master's and doctoral degrees in more than 20 disciplines. And, our small student/faculty ratio of 10:1 means you will interact closely with professors in the classroom, allowing you to build relationships that range from mentor to colleague.

- CGU has more than 2,000 students enrolled during the year. About 900 are full-time students, 450 part-time, 700 in doctoral studies, and 65 in continuous registration.
