Established in 1882, The University of Findlay is an accredited private, coeducational institution located in northwest Ohio. It is within a two-hour drive of Columbus, Ohio; Cleveland, Ohio; and Detroit, Michigan. The campus is situated in Findlay, a Midwestern city of 37,000 residents noted for its safe, friendly atmosphere and high quality of life.

Full-time enrollment is approximately 3,900, including more than 400 international students from 29 countries and territories.

Among The University of Findlay's educational services is the Intensive English Language Program (IELP), which trains international students in the English language and American life and customs. The IELP prepares students to succeed by improving their spoken and written English, using computers to prepare classroom assignments and introducing the American higher education system.

University credit is earned while studying in the IELP. Students have an opportunity to interact with American students and community members, as well as a chance to take field trips to points of interest in the surrounding area.

The university has nearly 60 areas of study leading to four-year bachelor's degrees, as well as master's programs. All programs are listed on the inside.

Findlay is a small, friendly campus where students receive individual attention from their professors. Students can choose from 70 student organizations and 27 intramural sports, allowing them to learn leadership and interpersonal skills outside of the classroom.

It has been recognized as one of "America's Best Private Colleges" by Institutional Research and Evaluation Inc., an independent research organization specializing in higher education.

Accreditations

The University of Findlay is authorized by the Ohio Board of Regents and accredited by the Higher Learning Commission as well as the national accrediting organizations for Athletic Training, Teacher Education, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physician Assistant, MBA, Nuclear Medicine Technology, Social Work and Environmental, Safety and Occupational Health Management. Its pharmacy program holds candidate status with the Accreditation Council on Pharmaceutical Education.



Housing and Living Spaces

The University of Findlay has three International Welcome Houses for new students. New international students may stay in the International Welcome Houses for up to 10 days while they decide whether they want to live on or off campus. The houses are located on campus, and each one is staffed with a graduate assistant to assist new students. All houses have furnished bedrooms, living room, kitchen, wireless Internet and laundry facilities. The cost is \$20 per night. Both on-campus and off-campus housing is available.

Recreational Services

- 23 intercollegiate sports (NCAA Division II and IHSA)
- 27 intramural sports, open to any student
- Cardio center with indoor track, fitness equipment and free weights
- Game room with arcade-style games and ping pong and air hockey tables

Health Services

The Cosiano Health Center is a free, walk-in clinic for students, faculty and staff. The health center can provide general health assessments, numerous diagnostic tests, wound care, first aid, physicals and referrals to specialists.

Transportation Services

A shuttle to the local shopping mall and grocery stores is offered free of charge on a weekly basis.
