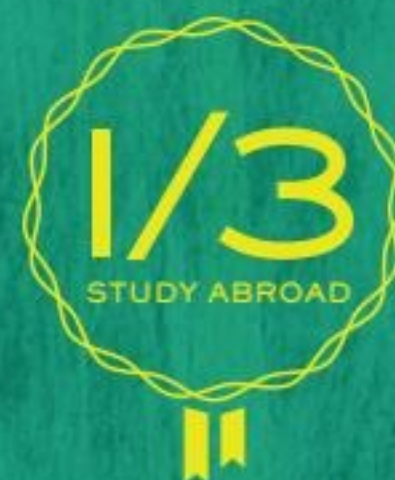

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Butler Application or Common Application
- Writing sample, personal statement, or essay (500 words or less)
- Official SAT and/or ACT scores
Butler accepts both the Pre-March-2016 SAT and the new SAT
- Official high school transcript showing coursework completed through junior year
- A Secondary School Report completed by your guidance office
- (Optional) Resumé outlining co-curricular activities and honors
- (Optional) 1-2 Letters of Recommendation

KEY DATES

- AUG** **August 1:** Application opens
- OCT-DEC** **Late October–Mid-December:**
Early Action admission decisions released
- NOV** **November 1:** Early Action Deadline
Early Action benefits include full academic scholarship consideration and honors program eligibility.
- DEC** **December 1:** Recommended FAFSA Filing Date
- MID-JAN** **Mid-January:** Financial aid notification begins
- FEB** **February 1:** Regular Decision Deadline
- MAR** **March 1:** Butler FAFSA Deadline
- MAY** **May 1:** National Candidate's Reply Date
A \$500 enrollment deposit is due to the Office of Admission. This deposit is refundable through May 1.
