School of Dental Medicine

With a focus on inter-professional experiences, the dental school's degree programs include a nationally recognized doctor of dental surgery (DDS), orthodontics and dentofacial orthopedics programs, and pediatric dentistry program (a collaborative program with Children's Hospital Colorado). Consistent with the school's mission to increase access to education and care, the International Student Program offers qualified graduates of foreign dental programs the opportunity to earn a DDS degree.

School of Medicine

SOM faculty rank seventh among U.S. public medical schools awarded federal research grants and contracts, and 22nd among all public and private medical schools, according to the Association of American Medical Colleges. Groundbreaking research is conducted in the fields of cancer, diabetes, pediatrics, health care systems, wellness and ophthalmology. Degree programs in medicine, physical therapy, physician's assistant, and medical scientist are available.

College of Nursing

With more than 110 years of contributions to nursing education, practice and research, the CU College of Nursing offers innovative curricula as well as nationally renowned research and practice faculty to support students' career ambitions.

Skaggs School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences

Degree programs include the doctor of pharmacy (PharmD), a Non-Traditional PharmD for working pharmacists who are licensed in their home countries, and PhD programs in pharmaceutical sciences, toxicology, and pharmaceutical outcomes research.

Colorado School of Public Health

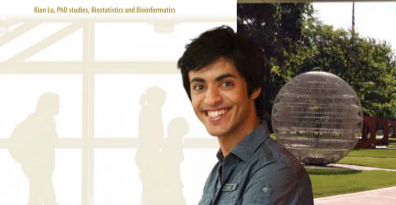

The school houses the Center for Global Health, a dynamic environment for research, training and education in global health with partner universities. The Center is designated as a World Health Organization (WHO) collaborating institution.

Graduate School

Offering interdisciplinary masters and doctoral programs, the Graduate School's internationally recognized faculty include members of the National Academy of Sciences and the Howard Hughes Medical Research Institute.

Engage in service learning, volunteerism, and internships in business, engineering, public affairs, arts and media, pre-health, and other fields. Special programs such as Curricular Practical Training (CPT) and Optional Practical Training (OPT) allow students with special permission to work off-campus within their field of study.

Student Housing

Enjoy on-campus living at Campus Village, where you will reside in affordable, furnished apartment-style student housing with full kitchens either in your apartment or on your floor. Your lease agreement includes utility, cable, and Internet costs. Amenities include a café that accommodates many dietary needs, a fitness center, and 24-hour professional staff. To improve the quality of the undergraduate experience, all first-year international students are required to live at Campus Village. Modern housing is available for returning students within walking distance of both campuses.

International Culture & Markets

In addition to numerous on-campus dining options, there are hundreds of cafés and restaurants and dozens of international food markets throughout the city. The city even hosts Denver Restaurant Week, a two-week celebration of the culinary scene that takes place every spring and offers reduced prices for delicious dining.

Safety

Denver is known as a friendly, livable city. The University of Colorado Denver is committed to the safety and security of its students, faculty, staff and visitors. Emergency-related information is provided on toll-free phone lines and through regularly updated websites and free online notifications. Campus police provide escorts to vehicles, crime prevention information, and teach personal safety classes; dispatchers provide coverage 24 hours a day.

Transportation

Convenient public transportation is located throughout the Denver metro area – and for CU Denver students, the discounted cost is included in tuition. Aside from light rail trains and city buses, there is a new city bicycle sharing program, Denver B-Cycle. Named one of the top five most innovative transportation companies by *Fast Company* magazine, the program has 500 bicycles at 50 stations throughout the city.

CU Anschutz Medical Campus

Built on 92 hectares, the Anschutz Medical Campus is designed to foster collaborative inquiry and discovery. On-site hospitals and centers include the Barbara Davis Center for Childhood Diabetes, Children's Hospital Colorado, the University of Colorado Hospital, and the University of Colorado Cancer Center. With 22 new core laboratories, more than \$400 million awarded annually in research funding, and nearby thriving bioscience companies, the university provides unique advantages for education, research and business development.

The CU Technology Transfer Office is ranked among the top 20 university research offices for creating start-up companies. Collaborations between bioscience companies, faculty researchers, and students at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus are flourishing, which means the opportunities for your education and research are excellent.

The Denver metropolitan area has one of the highest concentrations of federally funded science and research centers in the nation, with research subjects ranging from the shrinking polar ice caps and climate change to the creation of turbulence-detection systems to minimize worldwide flight delays. Adjacent to the CU Anschutz Medical Campus, research education and life sciences thrive in the 234 hectare Fitzsimmons Life Sciences District.
