Sean Reilly. Environmental Hero, Climber, Researcher.

Sean cares about the Earth. A lot. In fact, before he arrived on campus at Santa Clara University he knew he wanted to save the planet. And he'll be the first to tell you, he picked the right school at the right time. As a junior at SCU, he conducted award-winning research in Australia that demonstrated how indigenous tourism could strengthen Aboriginal communities and help them move from welfare to sustainability. Sean gained more hands-on, real-world experience when he traveled to San Diego with Professor Hari Mix to present results and coordinate future research with the Scripps Institution of Oceanography and the Center for Western Weather and Water Extremes. The best part? Sean's just getting started.

Why I Chose SCU. I knew I wanted to study environmental science in college—but at the right place. After being admitted to several schools, I sat down with the heads of the environmental science departments at each university to talk about their programs. When it was all over, it was clear SCU had everything I was looking for. The foundation of our education is rooted in Jesuit values—we're continuously pushed to use our education for the betterment of society—which goes hand in hand with my environmental studies major. It's the perfect fit.

What Makes SCU Unique. I've taken advantage of quite a few research opportunities, working with students and faculty outside of my core courses—people in economics, engineering, and philosophy. Passionate people. Because students and faculty at SCU share a mutual passion to better the world, we're a close-knit community. Through it all, faculty get to know students on a personal level. So when our hands go up in class, professors call on us by name. It feels good to belong to this community—it's tough to come by at other schools.

My Most Rewarding Experiences. I'm president of Grass Roots Environmental Efforts Now (GREEN), a club dedicated to the promotion of sustainable and environmentally conscious behavior. One of the most rewarding campus events we organize is GREEN Earth Week—each day emphasizing a specific call to action to encourage student participation in sustainability on campus and increase awareness of individual environmental impact. GREEN Earth Week culminates with an Earth Day Parade on the final afternoon of the week.

What New Students Should Know. It's easy to find people who share your interests. Through my clubs, courses, organizations, and residence halls, I surround myself with people who share my commitment to addressing environmental issues. I've also got a good group of friends who love rock climbing as much as I do.

Khaled Hosseini. Alumnus, Author, Humanitarian.


Born in Kabul, Afghanistan, Khaled eventually found himself in the United States, where he'd receive a bachelor's degree in biology from Santa Clara University. Today he's one of the most recognized and bestselling authors in the world. His books, *The Kite Runner*, *A Thousand Splendid Suns*, and *And the Mountains Echoed*, have been published in more than 70 countries—selling more than 40 million copies. As the founder of The Khaled Hosseini Foundation, he dedicates himself to providing humanitarian assistance for the people of Afghanistan. The paths of life have guided Khaled down many roads, and one of those roads passed through our campus.

Why I Chose SCU. I did my research but knew SCU was a well-regarded university before all of that. The campus is beautiful, and the smaller classes prevented me from getting lost in a sea of humanity. The Jesuit education was drawing, too. French Jesuits educated me for several years, while living in Kabul, so I knew from experience that Jesuits are excellent instructors. My time at SCU validated my expectations.

How SCU Challenged Me. High school was a breeze; SCU wasn't. College required a lot more effort. Bright students filled every classroom, all posing thought-provoking questions. We really pushed one another to perform academically. I had an excellent hybrid experience, building a strong foundation of education in basic sciences while also engaging in stimulating conversations about philosophy and ethics with great instructors.

My Message to Incoming Students. Expect to be challenged in a friendly and intimate learning environment. You'll have access to brilliant minds and passionate instructors. SCU gives you a big university caliber education in a small school setting.

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



In the classroom, he's preparing for a career in broadcasting and communications. Outside the classroom, courts, study tables, studio booths, and training facilities, he's paving the way for a bright future—wherever he's headed.

Why I Chose SCU. The true draw to SCU was the pairing of excellent academics with a historically successful athletic department. And plenty of NCAA and NBA greats have come out of our program—like two-time NBA MVP Steve Nash—that's huge. But my official visit to campus was the tipping point: the community was incredibly welcoming—inside and outside the athletic offices.

What I've Learned. It may sound clichéd, but I'm learning how to push myself in all aspects of life. Athletically, my coaching and training staffs stress the importance of the discipline and focus required to prepare to the best of my ability for every game. Academically, I've learned to build relationships with my instructors. Those same instructors understand how busy my schedule can get, yet they push me just as hard as any other student.

Opportunities That Stand Out. My experience with EYEBRONCO, the official video network of SCU athletics, stands out. The network produces exclusive feature stories, highlights, and interviews to give our community a closer look into Bronco athletics. EYEBRONCO approved the creation of my own show, *Long Walks with Jared*, where I've interviewed coaches, teammates, our University president, and the commissioner of the WCC. It's been a great supplement to my communication courses.

My Message to New SCU Students. Take advantage of the opportunities that surround you. You're in the heart of Silicon Valley. You have the chance to innovate and to be entrepreneurial. 



THE CROP CRUSADER

Allison Kopf. Alumna, Entrepreneur, Greenhouse Guru.

As a Santa Clara University undergraduate, Allison led a project for the US Department of Energy's Solar Decathlon, finishing third in competition among 20 international teams. And now, she's changing the face of indoor agriculture. Just five months after launching Agrilyst, a company that makes software designed to track and optimize production in greenhouses and indoor farms, she and her co-founder walked off with top honors at San Francisco's 2015 TechCrunch Disrupt Startup Battlefield competition.

What SCU Did for Me. This place rocks—I've said it a million times. I owe so much to SCU. It fostered such a rich academic environment; I was relentlessly pushed to use my education for good. Much of that comes from the nature of how the University operates.

How My Education Mattered. The Solar Decathlon didn't feel like just another class project—because it wasn't. It was an international competition among colleges and universities—hosted by the Department of Energy—to design, build, and operate the most attractive and energy-efficient solar-powered house. And with the backing of the Department of Energy, there were a lot of eyes on the competition. So much so that the representative for California's Seventeenth Congressional District came out to visit and see what we were doing. Best of all, we were building something we could actually live in and use. That mattered.

The Way SCU Made Me Think Differently. Jesuit education is important. It teaches us to consider the potential outcomes of our decisions—prior to making them—in personal and business life. So instead of founding startups or developing apps because they're cool, we're taught to bring to life ideas that help create a more just world. We learn to build ethical companies instead of just another app.

What My Idea Can Do for the World. To meet climbing global demand, we need to increase food production 70 percent by 2050. To help get there, growers' production will need to be more efficient and sustainable—which can be achieved through hydroponic, indoor farming methods. These methods are about 10 times more land effective and 20 times more water effective than traditional outdoor agriculture.




