

## OUR FACILITIES

# Bucks is home to a wide variety of industry specific courses, and to provide our students with the best education we have invested heavily in our facilities.

We have a lot to offer; from drama, dance and audio studios, to production suites, healthcare simulation labs, and a human performance lab.

In May 2016, Bucks opened a new 'Launch Pad' boardroom space, providing free meeting facilities, Wi-Fi and IT for students and alumni entrepreneurs.

For our media production students, our audio and music facilities include state-of-the-art recording studios, ranging from edit rooms to Pro Tools HD studios with attached live rooms and vocal booths. We also have a choice of film studio spaces, and a mobile outside broadcasting unit.

If you are interested in art and design, our High Wycombe Campus is equipped with modern workshops for handling materials, including laser cutting, 3D printing, Apple workstations, printmaking, knitting and sewing machines. The School also has workshops for using wood, metal and plastics. In 2015, we opened a multi-million pound Human Performance, Exercise and Wellbeing Centre at our High Wycombe Campus. The centre hosts a state-of-the-art Sports Injury and Physiotherapy Clinic, Integrated Human Performance Laboratory, and a three lane running track with motion-capture technology.

We have also invested in an Elite S812 flight simulator - our Private and Commercial Piloting students use this dual pilot simulator to develop and progress such skills as instrument and cross-country flying.

Our Uxbridge Campus is home to our simulation suites and many of our nursing and healthcare courses. We are the only UK University to combine state-of-the-art simulation laboratories with the expertise of a moulage specialist who is skilled in applying mock, and often gorily realistic, injuries for training purposes.

A new Cyber Resilience Centre is currently under development at our University Campus Aylesbury Vale (UCAV). Dedicated classrooms will allow students to focus on the most pressing security issues, using specialist computing technology. In addition to our course specific facilities, we also offer:

- an onsite gym full of the latest equipment and technology with discounted membership for students
- the Gateway Library at our High Wycombe Campus is spread over four floors and includes computer suites and study rooms
- our art and design workshops house industry-specific equipment, from print and dying facilities to sewing and knitting machines.

University isn't just about studying though. When you need a break, The Lounge and The White Room are our Bucks Students' Union venues, offering food and drink during the day and entertainment in the evenings, plus a handy cash machine. We've also got onsite cafes for food, drinks or an informal meeting place.

# APPLYING FOR

If you're an international student coming to study a full-time course of more than six months duration you will need to obtain a Tier 4 Student Visa in your country of residence before travelling to the UK.

You cannot apply for a Visa at the airport when you arrive. If you are already in the UK, you may be eligible to apply for a Tier 4 Visa from the UK, though depending on your status, you may have to return home to apply.

## The Tier 4 Student Visa

The Tier 4 General Student Visa allows you to:

- study a full-time course of more than six months' duration in the UK (you cannot study a part-time course)
- extend your leave (permission) to remain in the UK, providing that you meet the requirements stipulated in the Tier 4 Policy Guidance
- work part-time during term time and full-time during your official university holidays, as stipulated by your course timetable.

## Part-time means:

- 20 hours per week for courses which are at degree level and above
- ten hours per week for courses which are below degree level (foundation degree/HND)
- you may also undertake a work placement without obtaining additional permission if it is an assessed part of your course; if your course has a work placement, this will be indicated on your Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS).

## Five year study limit

Any new Tier 4 application must lead to you spending no more than five years in total on courses at degree level (National Qualifications Framework level 6/7). Any time you have already studied in the UK with a Tier 4 or Student Visa at this level will be included in the five years. Additional years are granted for PhD study.

## **Education progression**

Students must demonstrate that the selected course is a progression from their previous education.

## What do I need in order to apply?

In order to make a successful application you will need to meet all the requirements for Tier 4 as stipulated in the Tier 4 Policy Guidance.

 you will need to have accepted an offer at Bucks and received a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) from Bucks to show that we will be acting as your Tier 4 sponsor

- you will also need to provide evidence that you meet the English language requirements for your course
- you will need to provide evidence that you have enough money to meet the Tier 4 Maintenance Requirement (tuition fees and living expenses).

## **Applying to Bucks**

For full-time undergraduate courses, you need to apply through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). This also applies to MSc Social Work. You'll find full instructions at **ucas.com**.

UCAS has a range of comprehensive guidance notes to help you though every step of the process. When you fill in your UCAS form, make sure you quote our UCAS institution name and code: BUCKS B94.

Also, remember to complete your personal statement with your application as best you can – it really is your opportunity to sell yourself. Along with this, you'll need one valid current reference for the majority of courses, although some do require two.

Above all, make sure your application is fully completed before you submit it to UCAS. An incomplete application may not be accepted.

## **Application deadline**

To guarantee that your application is considered, make sure it's submitted by the 15 January deadline.


Any applications received after this deadline can only be considered if we have available spaces and it has been received before the international deadlines as published on our website. Please ensure that you carefully adhere to all additional UCAS deadlines too with regards to replying back to your decisions so that you do not lose any offers made to you.

### **Entry requirements**

We can accept a variety of European and international qualifications, providing that they are equivalent to our entry requirements. We use UK NARIC to assess these equivalencies and, if you wish, you can request a Statement of Comparability yourself by visiting naric.org.uk or bucks.ac.uk/ internationalentryrequirements. For the latest course information and most up to date entry criteria please visit our website at **bucks.ac.uk/courses**.

## What happens after I apply?

We'll screen your application to make sure it's fully completed and that you meet the entry requirements. If we need any further information, such as copies of your passport or qualifications, we'll email you with details of everything we need to fully process your application. We will also ensure that your application meets the regulations for a Tier 4 Visa if applicable.



Once we have all the required information, we'll make a decision on your application, which will be shown on UCAS Track. This could be:

- asking you to attend an interview: this could be through Skype if you are outside of the UK - the date and time will appear on Track and we'll email you with any additional details. You must reply to confirm your attendance. For further information, please visit
  bucks.ac.uk/courseinterviews
- conditional offer: this offer is made if you're currently completing your qualifications or if we are waiting on further documents. The conditions will be visible on Track if you click into the offer
- unconditional offer: this offer is made if you've met all the academic entry requirements

 rejection: if your application is not suitable, the reason will be shown on Track. In some cases, additional feedback can be given but we cannot guarantee this.

You can log in with your details on **ucas.com/track**.

Once you've received a decision from all the universities you have applied to, UCAS will tell you the deadline by which you need to respond. You must select a firm (first choice) and insurance (second choice) institution by the stated deadline. Otherwise, UCAS will assume you no longer want your offers and will decline them on your behalf.

To guarantee your place, you must meet or exceed the conditions of your offer (if applicable). If you don't meet any of your offer conditions, your application will be reviewed on an individual basis to see if we're still able to accept you. If you require a Tier 4 Visa to study with us, further processes and documents will be required to meet UKVI (UK Visas and Immigration) regulations. This will include an admissions interview, payment of a deposit and providing bank statements before we can release you a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS). Please see our separate section for Immigration requirements.



# Your postgraduate

## Applying to Bucks

For postgraduate applications, you can apply directly to us using the online application portal at **bucks. ac.uk/international/application**. Please also carefully read the application guidance notes.

If you require a Tier 4 Visa to study in the UK please visit the UKVI website for the most up-to-date information **gov.uk/tier-4-general-visa**.

## What should I include with my application?

When submitting your application, you will be advised of any additional supporting information we require. Full details are given in the application guidance notes as documents will need to meet with UKVI guidelines if you require a Tier 4 Visa. In summary these documents may include:

- copies of your qualification final certificate/transcripts, such as your BA (Hons) or BSc (Hons) degree.
- copy of your English language proficiency certificate. Tier 4 applicants will need to provide an IELTS or Trinity College certificate that meets UKVI requirements. Some exemptions apply and non-Tier 4 applicants may be able to provide an equivalent certificate.
- a personal statement explaining why you wish to study this course and any relevant experience you may have.
- a clear copy of your passport and all visas, past and present, for the UK if applicable (visit bucks.ac.uk/ international for information).
- copies of all qualifications and CAS obtained in UK if you are a Tier 4 applicant.

## Is there an application deadline?

For applications made via UCAS, the deadline for submission is 15 January. Please see our website for international deadlines. We recommend you apply as early as possible as some courses require interviews. For more information, visit **bucks.ac.uk/international**.

## What happens after I apply?

As many of our qualifications are professionally based, we review your whole application including qualifications and work experience in order to determine your suitability. The team will also ensure that all information and documents meet with UKVI regulations if applicable.

The Admissions team may refer your application to the course leader. For some of our courses you are required to attend an interview and this may be conducted via Skype if you are outside of the UK. The decisions are then forwarded to the Admissions team and your details are updated on the system accordingly.



Updates and offers are communicated through email so please ensure these details are correct on your form. Offers must be formally accepted by the deadline date given in your offer letter.

If you have made an application via UCAS, any updates regarding your application will be visible on your UCAS Track.

If you require a Tier 4 Visa to study with us, further processes and documents will be required to meet UKVI (UK Visas and Immigration) regulations. This will include an admissions interview, payment of a deposit and providing bank statements before we can release you a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS). Please see our separate section for Immigration requirements.

## Our admissions policy

We welcome applications from prospective students from all backgrounds, and will consider applications on a fair and equal basis. We're committed to widening access for all those who can benefit from higher education and to widening participation from under-represented groups. Coming to university is always a big move. Of course, you'll want the certainty of knowing where you are going to live. You'll also want a place that fits in with your studies and suits your social life, and most of all, you'll want somewhere you'll feel at home.

At Bucks, settling into your new surroundings will be easy, thanks to our range of comfortable halls of residences.

If you're a full-time, first year student and you apply for accommodation before 30 June of the year of entry we can guarantee you a place in one of our halls. We will seek to offer a room to late applicants and applicants who apply to Bucks through Clearing. There are of course other options, should you not want halls.

All of our halls have 24-hour security, high speed internet and laundry facilities on site.

## Hughenden Park Student Village

Our purpose-built student accommodation near Hughenden Park currently houses over 410 students. The village consists of smart self-contained flats accommodating up to six residents in en suite rooms; there are also a limited number of en suite studio apartments with balconies. It is approximately 15 minutes' walk from the University.

## **Windsor House**

Occupying three floors over the Chilterns Shopping Centre in High Wycombe town centre, Windsor House is a 72-room block of accommodation. It provides a mixture of seven-bedroom clusters and nine individual studios, each with en suite facilities

## Brook Street Halls of Residence

Brook Street is located right next to the Eden complex and bus station in the town centre of High Wycombe. Recently refurbished, Brook Street is a complex of nearly 400 bedrooms split between flats of varying sizes with shared facilities. There is also a fantastic community spirit here for students to enjoy.

### Other accommodation

There is also accommodation available in the private sector. Whether it's housing through estate agents, private rentals or lodgings, we'll endeavour to help you find the accommodation that meets your needs.

## **Uxbridge students**

In Uxbridge, students will be invited to our 'Meet and Greet' days, where you can meet other students and view any houses that might be available. All our managed properties are wellmaintained and inspected regularly. We operate a small head tenancy scheme in Uxbridge, where students rent from the University, rather than privately. Also, Uxbridge students can apply for halls in High Wycombe and use the free inter-campus bus link.

Our fully equipped gym at the High Wycombe Campus is also used for teaching as well as being open to students.

## Media and New Technologies

Our £100m Gateway building has Audio, Film and TV studios furnished with equipment by leading manufacturers who continue to sponsor our courses. We have partnerships with BBC Introducing who showcase the latest music talent at our facilities, captured and edited by Bucks students. Our outside broadcasting mobile unit also contains the very latest equipment for broadcasting live events such as music concerts and sports matches.

Our Computing, Web Development, and Independent Games Design courses are also taught from specialist suites in the Gateway Building.

## Music, Performance and Events

Bucks has a 20 year heritage of Music and Live Events courses and counts itself as one of the most influential educators in the music business. Or, if you want to express yourself through movement or acting, the experience at Bucks will help develop your skills in entrepreneurship as well as steer your future to a career within the performing arts.

Our excellent facilities include a drama studio, dance studios, and a high specification performance lab.
