

## CAMPUS LIFE

Campus life is a key part of your university experience. Most students spend a major part of their time on campus, so we have invested in our campuses to make sure they meet your day-to-day needs.



**Headington Campus**  
Just over a mile east of the city centre, Headington Campus is our busiest. Here you will find our new award-winning John Henry Brookes Building, which is changing the lives of our students. It houses the main library, high-tech lecture theatres and teaching facilities, social learning areas, Brookes Union and student services.

Headington Campus is also home to a sports centre, medical centre and has our nursery for children nearby. Students of the arts, built environment, health and life sciences, most humanities courses, law, publishing, social sciences and international pathways courses are based on our Headington Campus – on one of our 3 sites: Headington Road, Headington Hill and Marston Road.

As part of major on-going investment we are creating a new home on the campus for our Business School and Oxford School of Hospitality Management. This is due to open in 2017.

High quality teaching and social learning spaces and brand new laboratories are also being developed in other major buildings on campus.

**Harcourt Hill Campus**

## WORK PLACEMENTS PAID AND UNPAID

Brookes' location in the UK's most prosperous economic region, and our well-established relationships with leading companies in a number of industries mean significant and relevant placements. These can be in the local area, elsewhere in the UK or overseas, depending on your course. Many of our courses offer the option of paid work placements. Other courses offer shorter unpaid work experience opportunities engaging with relevant companies on consultancy projects. Some have mandatory professional practice placements.

### Undergraduate paid work placements

A year spent on a **paid placement** is an option on all of our undergraduate degree courses in the **Business School**, and **Departments of Computing and Communications Technologies**, and **Mechanical Engineering and Mathematical Sciences**, as well as some courses in **Languages** and the **School of the Built Environment**.

For some courses, like **International Hospitality Management**, **Business and Automotive Management**, **Construction Project Management** and **Quantity Surveying** this is a compulsory year-long paid placement.

### Undergraduate unpaid work placements

Some courses have **optional unpaid** long placements including many of our courses in **Biological, Medical and Environmental Sciences**. Others have **compulsory unpaid** placements including **Equine Science and Thoroughbred Management, Early years and Primary Teaching** courses.

There are also specific professional practice opportunities, such as, clinical practice for **Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy and Social Work**.

### Undergraduate work experience

Many courses offer shorter unpaid work experience, for example courses in **Arts** which offer opportunities in the creative and cultural sectors.

### Postgraduate paid work placements

A **long paid placement** is an option on all of our **Marketing, Hospitality and Tourism, Computing and Communication Technologies** postgraduate degree courses. The **International Business Culture and Languages** course has a mandatory placement which may be paid or unpaid depending on the setting.

### Postgraduate unpaid work placements and experience

Many of our **Business and Management** courses have optional unpaid work-based project opportunities.

Other courses have mandatory unpaid professional practice placements including **Social Work, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy and Primary Education**.

## INDUSTRY MENTORS AND ADVISORS

Many of our departments including the **School of the Built Environment** and the **Oxford School of Hospitality Management** offer mentoring schemes where students are matched with expert mentors in their fields. Others such as the **Oxford International Centre for Publishing Studies** have frequent talks by and 'speed-dating' with industry experts.

### Work placement and exchange

There is also a European work placement programme (part of Erasmus+) which funds the opportunity to work elsewhere in Europe as part of your studies, if a placement is a recognised component of your programme.



Before your course starts you will receive information on how and when to pay our fees. You can pay in 2 instalments. For some courses you will need to pay a deposit.

## What are the visa financial requirements?

To apply for your visa you must be able to show that you have enough money to pay your tuition fees and to live in the UK for the first year of your course.

## How much will it cost to live in Oxford?

The amount of money you will need for living costs will depend on your course and lifestyle.

This table gives an example of the cost of living for a student living in halls at Oxford Brookes for 2016/17. Rent for privately rented accommodation may be less, but as you will have to pay for utilities it is likely to come out around the same.

The costs will vary significantly from student to student, so you should think realistically about what you spend. Postgraduate research students may also need an extra £600 - £1000 for expenses such as thesis presentations, travel and equipment for research.

### GUIDE TO WRITING YOUR PERSONAL STATEMENT

When applying to a UK university you will need to provide a personal statement as part of your application. This statement is your chance to convince the admissions tutor of your suitability for the course you have chosen to study.

For undergraduate applications your statement will be sent via UCAS to up to 5 different tutors, so you need to focus on the subject area and the skills that you have, as well as your plans for the future.

For postgraduate courses you will generally apply separately to each university and so you will need to be much more focused on your reasons for choosing that particular course at that particular university. If you are switching to a different area of study you need to clearly explain your reasons for doing so.

Remember that many courses are competitive and having the published academic grades will not guarantee you admission. The personal statement is your chance to show that you will be more suitable than other candidates.

### APPLY FOR YOUR VISA

If you are from a country which is not in the European Economic Area (EEA) or Switzerland you will need to have a student visa to come to the UK.

If you need a **Tier 4 student visa**, Oxford Brookes must first provide you with a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS). This is required to comply with UK Visas and Immigration regulations.

**To receive a CAS please follow these steps:**

- 1 accept your offer
- 2 complete and submit the online CAS Information Form using the link in the email you will receive after you accept your offer
- 3 submit a copy of your passport including any previous UK visas.

You should apply for your CAS and visa as early as possible to make sure you can arrive before your course begins. However you cannot apply for your visa more than 3 months before your course starts.

If you are coming to Brookes for a short course and you are not continuing on to another course you can apply for a **Short-term Study Visa**.

# PRE-SESSIONAL ENGLISH

Meet the language requirements for your bachelor's or master's degree.

Our University English course allows you to qualify for undergraduate and postgraduate courses, and gives you the skills to succeed throughout your studies.

- Four levels of classes for students with IELTS 4.5 up to 6.5
- No need to take an external language test to progress onto your degree
