

Employability and our links with industry

GCU strives to ensure its programmes give students the skills required in the global workplace, for example 55% of our undergraduate programmes offer opportunities for hands-on work experience.

The University develops its programmes to meet the evolving needs of business and industry and many of GCU's programmes are accredited by industry bodies or created in partnership with professional organisations. For example, GCU was the first Chartered Institute for Securities and Investment Centre of Excellence specialising in financial services operations.

Our programmes are supported by major global brands including Santander and M&S.

Our focus on employability means 96% of GCU's graduates are in employment or further study within six months of graduating (DLHE 2016).

Research

The 2014 Research Excellence Framework (REF), which assesses the quality of research across UK universities, judged GCU to be the top modern Scottish university by research power; 89% of the University's research activity in allied health professions is ranked in the highest categories of world-leading and internationally-excellent. In fact, GCU

is ranked in the top 20 in the UK for both allied health research and built environment research.

Global partnerships

As well as being home to almost 2,000 international students from 100 countries, GCU has campuses in London and New York and partnerships with leading institutions around the world including in: China, India, North America, South America, Oman and Bangladesh.


Private accommodation



One of Europe's most fashionable and vibrant cities, Glasgow is a former industrial powerhouse that has blossomed into a major cosmopolitan and cultural capital. The warmth and friendliness of the city's people, known as Glaswegians, is legendary and the city was named a must visit destination in 2016 by National Geographic, featuring top 5 in it's list of 'best of the world'.

Beautiful architecture

Scotland's largest city is surprisingly compact and easy to explore from GCU's centrally located campus. A stroll through the city's streets reveals its fascinating history and magnificent architecture – including many buildings designed by the world-famous Charles Rennie Mackintosh – alongside thriving bars, galleries and restaurants and a shopping experience rated the UK's best outside London's West End.

A student city

Hosting three large universities, the city is home to over 64,000 students (that's nearly 11% of the population) from around the world.

Events and days out

Nearly 2.5 million tourists visit Glasgow every year to enjoy its largely free museums, including the magnificent Kelvingrove Gallery and the iconic Riverside Museum (2013 Museum of the Year EMYA), which are complemented by a flourishing visual-arts scene. One of only nine UNESCO Cities of Music in the world, Glasgow hosts a vibrant music scene whether you prefer contemporary, classical, Celtic or country, and throughout the year the city hosts festivals celebrating everything from film, comedy, Celtic music, books, and art, to Shakespeare, food and piping.

With more green space per square mile than any other UK city, there are plenty of pleasant walks to enjoy.

Scotland's sports capital

In 2014 the city hosted the Commonwealth Games, attracting millions of visitors from all over the world, and was ranked the world's eighth best sports city (SportBusiness, Ultimate Sports City 2014 Awards).



Fashion and shopping

Glasgow has been rated the best place to shop in the UK outside London's West End, so it is ideal for students with a passion for fashion. Glasgow's 'Style Mile' showcases designer labels and high-street brands, and there is also a great range of independent and vintage shops, cementing the city's growing global profile as a leading retail, cultural and style centre.

Excellent transport links

Glasgow Caledonian University is ideally located in the city centre, close to road, rail and bus links as well as all the amenities of a vibrant city. In fact, GCU is ranked first in Scotland for transport links (ISB 2015). Two stations on Glasgow's metro system and two train stations with links to the rest of the UK are just minutes from the campus, and the city's bus and coach hub is just across the road. As well as links to the rest of Scotland and the UK, there are regular bus services to Glasgow International Airport, which is 15 minutes away.

Step one Submitting your application

Deadlines for applications

There is no fixed deadline for many of our postgraduate programmes, but please check the webpage of the course you are interested in for a closing date. In all cases we recommend you apply as early as possible to ensure there is plenty of time to process your visa.

Receipt of application

When we receive your application, we will email you to let you know and include a student ID, which should be used in all your communications with the University.

Where possible, for postgraduate applications we will endeavour to process your application within two days of receiving your completed application. Please ensure you have submitted all relevant supporting documents, such as academic transcripts, references and SELT test results if known, to ensure your application can be processed as quickly as possible.

Step two Our decision

All decisions on applications are emailed to applicants. We may request further information from you before making an offer.

You will receive one of three responses from us:

- Conditional offer: you must meet the conditions included in the offer letter before an unconditional offer can be issued. Once the conditions have been met and the University has received all relevant documentation, we will email you an unconditional offer.
- Unconditional offer: if you have satisfied all of the University's entry criteria, you will receive an unconditional offer.
- The University is unable to offer you a place:

You will be notified by email. If you have not met the University's entrance criteria for your programme, we may refer you to a suitable foundation programme, for example INTO GCU. See page 42 for more information on its programmes.

* Please note that applications submitted through UCAS will also have decisions communicated through UCAS Track, which can be checked online.

Step three Accepting your offer

To accept an unconditional offer of a place, you must confirm your acceptance by email or via an overseas agent. On receipt of your acceptance, we will email you information about what to do next, such as paying your

deposit, and how to book accommodation if you need it. Once your deposit payment has cleared, you will receive an email confirming your Certificate of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number and the information you need to make your visa application.

Visa deadlines

Please contact your local visa office www.gov.uk/visa-processing-times Please be aware of visa processing times. Early payment of deposit is recommended to allow enough time to receive the documentation required for your visa application.

Equal opportunities: Fair admissions

In accordance with its Charter, the University takes no account of religious, racial, gender, age, political consideration or sexual orientation in admitting students.

Disability/special needs are not usually a bar to entry to programmes, but you are encouraged to declare these fully at an early stage so that any special arrangements are made before you join us. You must also declare past criminal convictions. This is particularly relevant for those applying to social work, nursing and health programmes.

Essential information

Studying at GCU

Students must have a valid visa that entitles them to study at GCU and the visa should be valid for the duration of their course.

International students at GCU must:

- Promptly update the University with any change to your visa information, contact details and emergency contact details
- Have a valid visa and prepare any visa extension 90 days before it expires via the Visa Immigration Support and Advice (V.I.S.A.) team
- Attend all your classes and contact your school if you are absent for any reason
- Not undertake paid work during term time for more than the permission stated on your visa (ie 10/20 hours per week or not at all)
- Attend our Tier 4 attendance monitoring census during term time
- Check your University email account at least weekly and obey any instructions relating to GCU or UKVI regulations or processes
- Attend re-registration and two checkpoints during the year to continue on your course.

Fees

Student fees include all tuition, examination and IT and access to the library. Applicants are advised of the fees they will incur once a formal offer of a place has been made. Fee levels for each programme can be found on

pages 36-41 and online at www.gcu.ac.uk/money/fees/international. If you are unsure about your fee status, please contact the Admissions and Enquiries service for advice.

The University needs you to pay a deposit when firmly accepting your unconditional offer to secure a place on your chosen programme. Once this deposit is received, you will be sent all the documents necessary to apply for your visa.

Living expenses

Students studying in Glasgow and requiring a Tier 4 student visa are required by the UKVI to show they have funds to cover living expenses of £1015 * for each month of their programme, up to a maximum of nine months. GCU London students are required to demonstrate £1265. Feel free to contact us if you have any specific questions about the cost of living in Glasgow or any other expenses. We'll be happy to help.

* Students should confirm the funds they require for a valid visa application through V.I.S.A. Team or UKVI website www. gov.uk/visas-immigration. Students are also required to pay Immigration Health Surcharge as part of their visa application, £150 per year. Applicants are advised to check www.gov.uk for current visa requirements.



Glasgow was ranked second cheapest city in the UK by cost of living (Mercer Cost of Living Survey 2015).

Working during your studies

Students must adhere to the working hours permitted under UKVI Tier 4 regulations as stipulated on their visa. Students can work a maximum of 20 hours per week in total across all work places where they might be able to find employment. They cannot work or contract for 20 hours per employer across multiple employers, and to do so would breach visa conditions which would result in the University withdrawing its sponsorship of the student.

English language

To study at GCU, students need to be

comfortable understanding lectures and coursework. If your native language isn't English, you will need to demonstrate your English proficiency by sitting a recognised English language test. There are some examples of accepted levels of proficiency below, but please note that some programmes require a higher level, see pages 36-41 for more details.

Minimum language requirements:

- IELTS: average score of 6.0 with no element below 5.5
- Pearson PTE: Overall score of 54 with 51 in Listening, 51 Reading; 51 Speaking and 51 Writing.

Other English speaking language qualifications may be accepted.

Scholarships and discounts

A range of scholarships and discounts are available to international students at GCU. Please note that these scholarships may be subject to change. For full details of all scholarship and bursary criteria visit: www.gcu.ac.uk/study/scholarships

Early Payment Discount

Self-funded and part self-funded international students who have been accepted on to a programme and pay the minimum fee deposit by the deadline and the remaining balance in full prior to the start of the programme will receive 5% off their fees (after any scholarship has been applied). A self-funded student is one who pays their own tuition fees or pays with the support of a relative or friend. Part self-funded students are those who receive funding support from their employer.

New International Student Scholarship

All new international undergraduate students will receive a scholarship of £1000 for each year of the degree. All new postgraduate international students will receive a scholarship of £1600 for year 1 of the

course and a further £1000 for year 2 where applicable.

GCU Loyalty Scholarships

These are open to students who have previously studied at GCU and are now applying to either an undergraduate or postgraduate programme. Details of previous study that qualifies for the loyalty scholarship is available at our website.

Loyalty scholarships for both undergraduate and postgraduate levels offers £2000 for year 1 of the programme and a further £1000 for each year of the programme.

Common Good Ambassador Scholarships

The Common Good Ambassador Scholarship will award 8 students who are undertaking a postgraduate taught programme and demonstrate a commitment to the common good with a Scholarship of £15,000.






